"CITY STEAM BAKERY."

This is the only establishment of the kind in the Province of P. E. Island. It was founded by the present proprietor, Mr. John Quirk, many years ago, and has since been carried on with marked success. Mr. Quirk's enterprise in this essential branch of business is most praiseworthy. The spacious premises which he occupies on Prince Street were erected by him and afford every facility for the prosecution of the extensive business in which he is engaged. All descriptions of plain and fancy bread and biscuit are made here daily, and a great boon is therefore rendered to mariners and others as they are enabled to secure supplies which are fresh and of the best quality. Cakes and confections for weddings, picnics, balls, &c., are made under the personal supervision of the proprietor, and, as a consequence, do not fail at all times to give the utmost satisfaction.

This tobacco manufactory was established in Charlottetown more than thirty years since by Mr. George C. Lowden, who was succeeded by Mr. M. Lowden. This gentleman conducted the establishment until his departure from the Province in 1874. The business at this time passed into the hands of the present firm, Messrs Hickey & Stewart, who had previously acquired a thorough knowledge of the trade.
