

The contract calls for the cleaning of the twelve inch main which runs from the Marsh Bridge through City Road, old Dorchester street extension. Paradise row, Main street. The first stretch will be from the bridge to Delhi street; the next to the foot of Dorchester street; another across the tracks to Paradise row and from the reshes Douglas avenue.

When the twelve inch main is cleaned a start will be made in the fifteen inch pipe which paralells the other from the Marsh bridge to Douglas avenue.

The work will require the services of about a dozen local men, of whom the water department will supply three, to be paid by the company.


