

### CASE AGAINST HALPORTS TO BE CONTINUED

Withdrawal Is Not Concurred in by Magistrate—Some Evidence Taken

The preliminary hearing of Samuel Halport, charged with obtaining money under false pretenses from Samuel Goldfeather, was begun in the police court yesterday afternoon. The direct evidence of the complaint was taken and his cross-examination by W. A. Ross for the defence was under way when the court adjourned until Monday afternoon.

At the opening of the hearing, Mr. Ross said that the complaint wished to withdraw the case. Magistrate Henderson replied that this could not be done as the Attorney-General had interested himself in the matter. In the past, he remarked, the practice followed in allowing cases to be withdrawn was to lose.

### SMUGGLER IS FINED

Woodstock Man is Jailed in Bangor in Liquor Case

BANGOR, Me., June 4.—In the U. S. District Court here today, Archie Job, of Woodstock, N. B., pleaded guilty to smuggling 13 gallons of alcohol at Houlton and was sentenced to a day in jail. George Hartley, of Moose River, paid a fine of \$250 for illegal possession.

### JOS. CHAMBERS MEETS DEATH IN CHATHAM YARD

Took Short-Cut to Work, Is Crushed Between Shunted Cars

CHATHAM, June 4.—A shocking fatality occurred here late yesterday afternoon when Joseph Chambers, a workman at the Fraser Co.'s pulp mill, was crushed between two freight cars on the Canada dock siding. The unfortunate man was on his way to work and when about to cross the track he was caught between the cars being shunted on the siding. Death was practically instantaneous.

### 3,725 PASS BETWEEN BOSTON, YARMOUTH

YARMOUTH, June 4.—The passenger travel by the Yarmouth and Boston steamers shows for the month of May a slight falling off as compared with the corresponding month in 1925. For the month 2,082 passengers left Yarmouth for Boston and 1,643 arrived here from that port, making a total of 3,725. In May, 1925, the number of passengers was 3,929, to go to Boston and 1,760 from Boston or a total of 5,689, being 44 in excess of the month just passed. In 1924 there were 4,306 and in 1923, 5,627, which was a record.

### 49 PASSENGERS ARE LANDED AT HALIFAX

HALIFAX, June 4.—The Furness liner Nova Scotia from Liverpool via St. John's, Nfld., arrived in port this evening to land 26 cabin and 23 third-class passengers or 49 in all. She will proceed to Boston tomorrow night with her passenger list augmented by a party of over 100 persons representing the Boston Association of Railway and Steamship Passenger Agents, which is returning home after spending two days in Halifax.

### TELFORD AGREES TO OPEN WAREHOUSES

Yields to Order of Customs Committee; Is Released From Jail

OTTAWA, June 4.—S. B. Telford, Rock Island, P.Q., merchant, under arrest on the charge of smuggling, this afternoon withdrew his opposition to an examination of his warehouses on behalf of the customs probe and agreed to observe the order of the customs probe committee. After 12 hours in the local jail Mr. Telford was taken to the committee rooms at the order of the committee. He was given the choice of going under custody to Rock Island and Derbyline, Vt., to open his warehouse on the American side to the committee's auditors or else to be brought before the Bar of the House and committed to the custody of the Sergeant-at-Arms. After some private conversation with his counsel, Mr. Telford chose the former alternative.

### 50 MINERS BATTLE POLICE DOWN IN PIT

Officers Recover 68 Bags of Coal After Struggle Near Abertillery

LONDON, June 4.—A desperate underground battle between fifty unemployed miners and a number of policemen took place in the pitch darkness of a lonely colliery in the mountains near Abertillery at 2.30 a. m. The police found a large gang of men from the face of the Red Ash colliery. Two of the men appeared from the mouth of the pit and one was arrested. The other escaped and gave the alarm to his companions.
