COMPROMISE URGED

Proposals Regarding Prohibition Made by Brewery Interests to Drys.

NEW YORK, Sept. 21.—Proposals for a compromise in the enforcement of prohibition have been made by Representatives of Brewing Interests to officials of the Anti-Saloon League, according to the New York World.

The paper declares the League officials are "not altogether unfriendly to the idea," and the matter is now under negotiation.

The reported compromise proposal would call for the legalization of the sale of wines and beers of "non-intoxicating" alcoholic content, and consideration of the tacit consent of the Anti-Saloon League to this would obligate the brewers to lend their support to the elimination of the bootlegger and the prevention of the use of "hard liquor."

TANKS OUST MULES IN OUTPOST RELIEF

FEZ, French Morocco, Sept. 22.—Tanks have supplanted mule trains for reuniting French outposts under fire.

The change was made in order to avoid losses of men and animals.

The new method was tried for the first time Monday when a dozen tanks, towing two score supply Camions, advanced from the base at Bab Morandi, eight miles to Dakar, protected by infantry and artillery fire from French troops on surrounding peaks.

WASHINGTON, Sept. 21.—Grain exports from the United States last week were 6,837,000 bushels, against 4,492,000 bushels the week before. Canadian grain exported through the United States ports was 528,000, against 538,000 the previous week.
