Order-in-Council Limits Further Impor-

Local wholesalers report that there are only moderate supplies of shelled and unshelled nuts on hand, and that these will be speedily reduced now that an order-in-council has been passed limiting further importations to those brought in under license. All lines of nuts have experienced an advance as a result of the scarcity. At this season of the year the demand is even greater than at Christmas times, nuts being used so largely in ice creams and in salads. There may be a further advance in articles in which nuts are used.




