2 cups flaked fish
1 cup seasoned white sauce
Mix the flaked fish with the white Cup Pudding-

Put into each greased cup I table-spoon of jam. Cover to one-half the cup with a batter made as follows: 1/2 cup of sugar

1 egg
1 cup milk
2½ cups flour
4 teaspoons baking powder
Cream the butter, add sugar gradually, and egg well beaten; mix and sift flour, baking powder, and salt; and alternately with milk to first mixture.
After turning into cups, put in the oven and bake.


