Education into this Diocese.

The Committee, considering that the Education of Children in sound principles of Religion, has ever been a prominent object of the Parent Sir ety, who have been very instrumental to the extensive adoption of this admirable system in England ; and being very desirous to extend the peculiar advantages it possesses, throughout these Colonies, have resolved to recommend and encourage its adoption to the full extent of their means In pursuance of this resolution, they have agreed to supply all Schools which may introduce it, with the necessary books, at the reduced prices of the Society; and gratuitously, where it may be required.
