the Missionaries. The Committee regret that, where the field of labor is so large, they have not yet been able to do more to make this Mission the instrument of such extensive benefit as they think it should be, and as they hope it yet shall be. In the eyes of the Committee their own labors appear exceedingly small and scarcely deserving of such a long Report. At the same time they trust that He who teaches us to "despise not the day of small things," will so increase and bless the Mission as to make it the source of eternal good to a long neglected class of our fellow countrymen and the means of fostering in our beloved land the "righteousness which exalteth a nation."
