REVIVAL OF THE WHALING INDUSTRY

Scenes at New Bedford Reminiscent of the Days of Long Ago—New Vessels Fitting Out.

NEW BEDFORD, Mass., March 6.—For the past two weeks, the waterfront of the city has resembled a picture from the past and memories of New Bedford's prestige when the whaling industry was at its height, have been revived. Not for many years has so much attention been given to the whale fishery as at present, and Thursday next, the first of a fleet of nine whaling vessels, now outfitting, will sail in quest of the great animals which half a century ago, laid the foundations of many a substantial fortune.

The few survivors of the old-time whalers, who for more than a generation have mourned the decline of what was once the city's principal industry, spend nearly all their spare moments on the wharves, exchanging reminiscences of thrilling struggles, smashed boats, shipwreck and the other hardships which often are the lot of those who go down to the sea in ships.

ZEPPELIN PLANS FOR POLAR TRIP

HAMBURG, March 6.—The Zeppelin north polar expedition, which was held yesterday under the presidency of Prince Henry of Prussia, Count von Helldorf, Prof. Dr. Alfred Wegener, were among those present. The committee discussed the program of the summer's work, which will be devoted to a preliminary expedition for the purpose of studying ice conditions. The government will be asked for the use of the exploring vessel Poseidon for about two months. The expedition will start for Spitzberg July 1 on an excursion steamer and there will transfer to the Poseidon. A Norwegian steamer will be used for the purpose of forcing an entrance into the Polar ice and the expedition will return at the end of August. Apparently no airship will be taken for summer use.

HIGH PRICES OF FOOD.

Recently two mass meetings of the working men of St. John have been held to consider this question which is of such vital importance to us all. The feeling of these meetings is that the present difficulties arise from combinations or trusts, both large and small, on the part of the dealers to boost the prices, and that the only effective reply would be combination on the part of the consumers. The co-operative movement which has such a great vogue in England and the more progressive European countries, was largely spoken of. At the last meeting a committee consisting of Mr. S. E. Logan, Rev. J. J. McCaskill, etc., etc., was appointed to look into this matter. This committee has met and a mass meeting will be held tonight in McLean's Building, Union street, at 8 p. m., to consider the report of this committee.
