**MODE ENOYR CHATHAM TO WORK**

FOR KING'S COLLEGE. Movement in Direction of University Endowment Extension Considered by St. Paul's Corporation.

Chatham, N. B., Nov. 14.—A meeting of St. Paul's Corporation was held last evening in the school room of St. Mary's church, to consider the Endowment Extension Movement. The matter was thoroughly discussed and a strong resolution of support was passed.

At a subsequent meeting Hon. J. P. Burchill and F. E. Neale, gave their report on this subject as delegates to the recent Synod meeting. Mr. Burchill in a forcible speech explained the object of the movement which was to raise \$125,000, of which \$25,000 was to be used in repairing the present buildings, as well as to go towards the building of a residence for the students. The balance of \$100,000 was to be an endowment fund, the interest of which would be sufficient to meet the needs of the college for some time to come. He pointed out as examples of what could be done by determined efforts, the success of Acadia University in raising a fund of \$200,000, of which \$20,000 was subscribed by Maritime people. Mr. Allison University is also finishing up an endowment fund of \$25,000 and he saw no reason why \$125,000 could not be raised for King's College.

Earnest work by all members of the church would amply accomplish the desired result. The movement has already been gotten under way in Nova Scotia and in one week they had secured there \$38,000, the people of Halifax subscribed \$25,000 alone and not even the whole city canvassed as yet.

This week, Nov. 12 to Nov. 19, will see the opening of the campaign in this diocese, and whatever the amount raised, \$20,000 or \$50,000, the principal will be held by the authorities of this diocese and only the interest will be paid over yearly to the college.

Mr. Neale also gave a very clear statement of the necessity for generously supporting the college. In Canada Powell, the new head of the college had a very strong and capable president, and the time was opportune to make King's an assured success.

This diocese as well as Nova Scotia is absolutely dependent upon King's for its supply of ministers. Today there are only three in the diocese and the principal to fill all the parishes and only through the keeping up of the college can an adequate number of candidates for the ministry be expected.

He made a strong appeal for every one to do his full share in this important work, for the future of the church itself in the Maritime Provinces depended upon it.

On motion Geoffrey Stead, F. P. Neale and E. Jordan were appointed a committee to deal with the work of collecting funds for the college. The committee has power to add to its membership and to begin an active, personal canvass among members of the congregation. Subscriptions are payable in five yearly instalments and an amount of \$100.00.

The announcement by the chairman Ven. Archdeacon Forsyth, that four subscriptions already received totalled \$1,500.

A ladies committee consisting of Mrs. M. A. E. Goggin, Mrs. J. G. Miller, Miss Armstrong and Miss Benson was appointed to canvass the women of the congregation.
