Olympic to Halifax.
It is reported unofficially at Halifax
yesterday that the Olympic will sail
this week from England with upwards
of 4,000 Canadians at present en-
camped at Rhyll. The information
comes from authoritative sources, al-
though the agents of the White Star
line here say they know nothing of
the arrangements.

Sell Under Repairs.
The steamer North Pines, which
was in Halifax recently on her way
from Quebec to an American port,
is still at Boston under repairs. She
has been given a trial trip, and it
was found that more repairs were
needed before the steamer sails for
New York, where she is to load for
South America. There was talk of
sending the North Pines up the
Rhine with a cargo of cotton and
she was measured for such a pas-
sage. Captain John Thompson who
was in command of the steamer has
been given command of one of the
large steamers just completed at the
Hos Island plant for the Shipping
Board, and which will load a full
cargo of grain at Philadelphia for
Plymouth, England.

S.S. Lansdowne Condemned.
The steamer Lansdowne, lying at
the Marine Pier, Dartmouth, has
been condemned. She has been
condemned. The S.S. Lansdowne
has been in the employ of the marine
department for a good many years.
She has been attached to the Halifax
agency, the St. John agency, the
Quebec agency. During the war she
