

T. WALLEY'S RINK IS AGAIN CHAMPION OF KOOTENAY.

The windows of Messrs Emory & Walley, on Baker street, are lit up with no less than six cups, won at the Cran-brook bonspiel by the Nelson rinks and players, and two more, local trophies, in which also A. T. Walley figures, the Burns and Bunyan cups, play for which started last night in the Vernon

At the Cranbrook bonspiel there were six outside rinks present, one each from Phoenix, Greenwood and Rossland and three from Nelson. Some surprise was expressed at the poor showing made by Rossland which openly claims the honor of always having the bonspiel in that city and yet cannot put forward more than one rink. Neither Revelstoke, Sandon nor Kaslo were represented. Cranbrook is situated so far from the centre of the Kootenay that the journey to it is somewhat lengthy and is there-fore discouraging to rinks coming from any distance. Even from Nelson the 5,000 journey from here consumed 17 hours while the state of the track made the make the bonspiel a success and the visitors were entertained right poyally. It is supposed that the club will make up a picked rink for this event but Nelson as yet has not followed this practice, which, however, is general elsewhere.

Thus there are seven trophies. Of these Nelson won the first, second, third, (Walley's rink); fifth (Judge Forin), and sixth (Richardson); Cranbrook won the fourth and seventh. On the Consolation cup coming up Greenwood, Phoenix and Rossland competed only of the visitors with some of the Cranbrook rinks, Ressland proving victor. A hard blow has thus been dealt to Rossland's pre-eminence in the game. Walley's rink proved to be the best there. It played 15 games and won 12. It was defeated by Pinkham of Cran-brook in the finals for the Walkerville after a hard struggle in which Walley was much handicapped, having played four games that day on heavy ice and his opponents came fresh to the hack. Walley got his revenge the next day, however, defeating Pinkham by 12 to nothing at the end of the sixth end, the Cranbrook men giving up the game at that stage quite satisfied. It was also defeated in the Allcomers, a cup presented by a company for which Mr. Walley is the local agent. For the Hudson's Bay and the Tuckett this rink did not enter. Its trophies are the first three on the list, the B. C. Association, the Grand Challenge and the Oliver. The Allcomers was captured by judge Forin and the Hudson's Bay by Richardson.
