12.30. Noon Henry Jack phoned from
Lahymains Re death of his father
Jack Moses (Whipson) at Kachowide Made
Henry will leave this afternoon to
bring body home.

At 2 P.M. met Henry at Station
and sent telegraph to Peter Jack, Kachowide.
See folio 195 - Telegraph Book

Left Peter Morse - a brother of
Jack Moses - at office until 5.30
He returned to Lahymains -
Mr Jack Whipson (Moses) returned from
Kachowide today wants to visit at 12.5. to bring
Jack's body to Kachowide - So call his
friends

1918

8.30 A.M. At office. Left at 9.0 Work for
Malahat Indian Reserve & post notices.
At meeting of Saanich Indians on the
Earl's Ridge on the 13th instant. Chief Black
Lily at home. It is said left this morning for
Victoria - Hele and Joseph working on town
at Malahat wharf. Talk to Duncans at
12.30 noon.

Mr Jack Whipson left at 10 A.M. for Kachowide

1.30 noon Mr. J. Gibbons phoned that
Henry Jack son of Jack Moses wanted
Department to pay expenses to bring his father's
body home - Call Miss at office

Michael Longayank. A Kachowide and wife at
office wrote till for Michael giving his
imprisonment and personal property to his
grand-daughter Alice. up pupil N.S. school

Worked at office 5.30 P.M.

Met train from Victoria at 5.40
Call Miss at office today of his father Jack
from Kachowide. Make. See notices.
