D. 1906, by Edouard Deville, Surveyor General of Som ion bands and of record in the Department of the Interior, containing by admeasurement One hundred and sixty and gorty hundredths (160 100)

Saving and excepting thereout all that portion which is covered by the waters of 6 arrot River, containing by admeasurement Thirteen and twenty hundraths (13 20) acres more or leas. The land hereby granted.

SAVING AND RESERVING, NEVERTHELESS, unto Us, Our Successors and Assigns, the free uses, passage and enjoyment of, in, over and upon all navigable waters that now are or may be hereafter found on or under, or flowing through or upper or Tract—of Land; also reserving all mines and minerals which may be found to exist within, upon or under such lands, together with full power to work the same, and for this purpose to enter upon, and use and occupy the said lands or so much extent as may be necessary for the effectual working of the said minerals, or the mines, pits, seams and veins containing the same; and also reserving thereout and therefrom all rights of fishery and fishing and occupation in connection therewith upon, around a lands, and also the privilege of landing from and mooring boats and vessels upon any part of the said lands and using the said lands in connection with the rights of fishery and fishing hereby reserved, so far as may be reasonably necessary to the exercise of such
