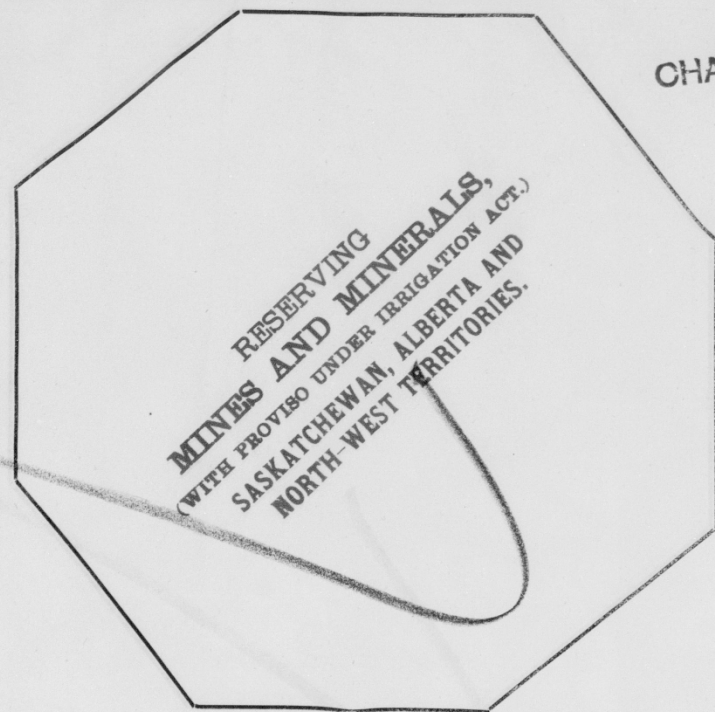

by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas KING, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India.

To all to whom these Presents shall come—GREETING:

Whereas the Lands hereinafter described are Dominion Lands within the meaning of the Dominion Lands Act.

AND WHEREAS

*Otto Fraligh, of Township Thirty-three, Range Twenty-eight, West
of the Second Meridian, in the Province of Saskatchewan, in Our Dominion
of Canada, Farmer,*

hereinafter called the grantee ~~has~~ applied for a grant of the said lands and after due investigation ~~has~~ been found entitled to such grant in the terms herein embodied.

Now Know Ye, that by these presents We do grant unto the grantee all that ~~at~~ Parcel or Tract of Land, situate, lying and being in the *Thirty-third Township, in the*

Twenty-eighth Range, West of the Second Meridian, in the Province of Saskatchewan, in Our Dominion of Canada, and being composed of

The North East quarter of Section Eighteen of the said Township

containing by admeasurement *One hundred and sixty (160)* acres, more or less;

SAVING AND RESERVING, NEVERTHELESS, unto Us, Our Successors and Assigns, the free uses, passage and enjoyment of, in, over and upon all navigable waters that now are or may be hereafter found on or under, or flowing through or upon any part of the said Parcel or Tract of Land; also reserving all mines and minerals which may be found to exist within, upon or under such lands, together with full power to work the same, and for this purpose to enter upon, and use and occupy the said lands or so much thereof and to such an extent as may be necessary for the effectual working of the said minerals, or the mines, pits, seams and veins containing the same; and also reserving thereout and therefrom all rights of fishery and fishing and occupation in connection therewith upon, around and adjacent to the said lands, and also the privilege of landing from and mooring boats and vessels upon any part of the said lands and using the said lands in connection with the rights of fishery and fishing hereby reserved, so far as may be reasonably necessary to the exercise of such rights.

To have and to hold the same unto the grantee—in fee simple.

Provided, and, in pursuance of the Irrigation Act it is hereby declared, that these presents shall not vest in the grantee any exclusive or other property or interest in or any exclusive right or privilege with respect to any lake, river, stream or other body of water, or in, or with respect to the water contained or flowing therein, or the land forming the bed or shore thereof.

At OTTAWA, this *Twenty-ninth* day of *June* in the year of Our Lord, one thousand nine hundred and *ten* and in the *first* year of Our Reign.
