VAL DE MAISON.	1916 5th Sept. 10th	4 p.m.	Weather - Bright and fine. The Battalion paraded at 8.45 a.m. and continued the move, arriving and billeting at a field near CONTAY. A conference was held at Brigade Headquarters, the C.O. and Adjutant attending. Operation orders No. 93 were prepared, only attached, and issued for move tomorrow. Hospital: Admitted, 5 other ranks: Returned 1 other rank. Leave:- 79384 Pte. W. Crippen was granted special leave and proceeded to England.	+ Appendix 3
CONTAY	7th. Sept.		The Battalion paraded at 9.00 a.m. and marched at 9.10 a.m. to BRICKFIELDS CAMP, via WARLOY - SEWIS, arriving at the Camp at 1.30 p.m., and bivouacked at the Camp which is overlooking the town of ALBERT. Company Commanders and Scout Officer proceeded to the trenches about to be occupied to look them over prior to the Battalion going in. Hospital: Admitted 4 other ranks: Returned, 1 other rank.	
BRICKFIELDS	8th Sept.		Weather - Fine and warm. 100 other ranks from each company paraded at 9.30 to undergo practice with aeroplanes. Battalion Sections paraded and proceeded with their own special training. The remainder of the Battalion was used in cleaning and straightening up the camp. Scouts were sent out to make a reconnaissance of the front line and the ground leading up to it. A working party of 50 other ranks was furnished for cable burying. Hospital: Admitted, 2 other ranks. Effective Strength - 1 Officer (Lieut. A.C. Hansen) and 6 other ranks struck off.	
BRICKFIELDS	9th Sept.	10-15 am. 3.00 p.m.	Weather - Fine but cold. The Battalion paraded for training with aircraft signals; Battalion Sections following their own branches of training. The Battalion furnished a working party of 100 men for cable burying; work lasted 5 hours. A conference was held at Brigade Headquarters at which the C.O. and Adj. were present. Commission: 79664 Pte. J. Rodgers, proceeded to England to report to Canadian Training Division.	

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
