BRICKFIELDS	1916 Sept. 9th		All ranks were furnished with patches of cloth, blue, 2" square set upon a base 2" x 3". The colour of the square denoting the 6th Brigade, and the colour of the base denoting the 2nd Canadian Division. The square denoting the 4th Battalion in the 6th Brigade, i.e. a circle denotes 27th Bn, a semicircle denotes 29th, a triangle denotes the 29th Bn, and a square denotes the 31st Bn. Battalion runners, a 2" strip of blue cloth to be worn on left sleeve, 3" from bottom. Scouts, a blue North point on the left sleeve. Bombers, a strip of green cloth 2" on the left sleeve, 3" from bottom. Carrying Parties for Engineers, red cloth similarly on left sleeve. Strength Decrease: 1 other rank transferred to Canadian Postal Corps. Hospital, admitted 2 other ranks. Weather - Bright and warm. Roman Catholics paraded for Divine Service. The Battalion paraded for Divine Service on Battalion Parade Ground. Holy Communion was celebrated at 11.00 a.m. Working Parties: 1 Officer and 100 other ranks, and another party of 30 other ranks were furnished for work towards front line. Operation Orders were received from the Brigade, and Battalion Operation Orders No. 94 copy attached, stating that the Battalion would relieve a portion of the 3rd and 4th Canadian Infantry Battalions. Battalion paraded and moved into support points in accordance with Operation Orders. Relief was completed at 8.30 p.m.

POZIERES.	11th Sept.	3.20	Weather - Bright and Clear. 29th Battalion in Front Line, 4th Canadian Infantry Brigade on right and 3rd Canadian Infantry Brigade on left. Lieut. Col. A.H. Bell, Major W.H. Hewgill and Company Officers visited Brigade frontage this morning. Enemy shelled promiscuously all country behind front line, especially POZIERES and Ridge in front of Battalion Headquarters, evidently, with a view to keeping down observation - 2449 Wt.
