3. Blankets will be rolled up in bundles of ten and turned in to Quartermaster! Stores by 7.30-a.m. BLANKETS. 3.

BAGGAGE.

Baggage and cook-kitchens will be ready for Transport by 8.00 a.m.

SALVAGE.

5. All articles of salvage must be collected and turned in to Quartermaster's Stores one hour before leaving billets.

SANITATION.6.

.6. Officers Commanding Companies and Battalion Sections will inspect their billets prior to moving off, and see that billets and grounds are left thoroughly clean.

BILLETS.

7. The usual billetting party will proceed ahead of the Battalion to destination, leaving not later than 8.00.a.m.
