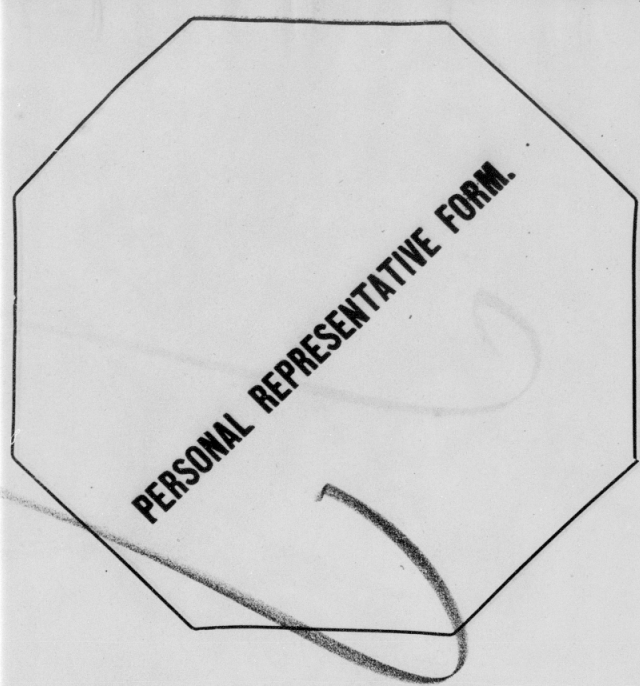

**Edward the Seventh**, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas KING, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India.

To all to whom these Presents shall come—GREETING:

Whereas the Lands hereinafter described are Dominion Lands within the meaning of the Dominion Lands Act.

AND WHEREAS Albert Robert Fanning, of the Municipality of Harrison, in the Province of Manitoba, in Our Dominion of Canada, Municipal Clerk, and James J. Lamb of the Municipality of Saskatchewan, in the Province of Manitoba aforesaid, Farmers,

hereinafter called the grantees have applied for a grant of the said lands to them in their capacity of personal representatives of the late William Kew,

in his lifetime of the said Municipality of Saskatchewan,

who died on or about the

Twenty-eighth day of April in the year of Our Lord, one thousand nine hundred and one.

and after due investigation have been found entitled to such grant in the terms herein embodied.

Now Know Ye, that by these presents We do grant unto the grantees all that Parcel or Tract of Land, situate, lying and being in the Fifteenth Township, in the Twentieth Range, West of the Principal Meridian, in the Province of Manitoba in Our Dominion of Canada, and being composed of

The North-West quarter of Section Twenty-one of the said Township.

containing by admeasurement One hundred and sixty (160) acres, more or less;

SAVING AND RESERVING, NEVERTHELESS, unto Us, Our Successors and Assigns, the free uses, passage and enjoyment of, in, over and upon all navigable waters that now are or may be hereafter found on, or under, or flowing through or upon any part of the said Parcel or Tract of Land; also reserving thereout and therefrom all rights of fishery and fishing and occupation in connection therewith upon, around and adjacent to the said lands, and also the privilege of landing from and mooring boats and vessels upon any part of the said lands and using the said lands in connection with the rights of fishery and fishing hereby reserved, so far as may be reasonably necessary to the exercise of such rights.

To have and to hold the same unto the grantees in fee simple in their capacity of personal representatives as aforesaid.

GIVEN under the Great Seal of Canada—Witness, Charles Jerome Jones, Esquire, a Companion of Our Imperial Service Order, Deputy of Our Right Trusty and Right Well Beloved Cousin and Counsellor the Right Honourable Sir Albert Henry George, Earl Grey, Viscount Howick, Baron Grey of Howick, in the County of Northumberland, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom, and a Baronet; Knight Grand Cross of Our Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Grand Cross of Our Royal Victorian Order, &c., &c., Governor General and Commander-in-Chief of Our Dominion of Canada.

At OTTAWA, this Seventh day of June in the year of Our Lord, one thousand nine hundred and nine and in the ninth year of Our Reign.
