George the Fifth, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas KING, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India.

To all to whom these Presents shall come—GREETING:

Whereas the Lands hereinafter described are Dominion Lands within the meaning of the Dominion Lands Act.

And Whereas Joseph Chernik of Township Thirty-eight, Range Twenty-six, West of the Third Meridian in the Province of Saskatchewan, in Our Dominion of Canada, Farmer

hereinafter called the grantee has applied for a grant of the said lands and after due investigation has been found entitled to such grant in the terms herein embodied

Now Know Ye that by these Presents We do grant unto the grantee all the Parcel or Tract of Land, situate, lying and being in the

Thirty-eighth Township in the Twenty-sixth Range, West of the Third Meridian in the Province of Saskatchewan in Our Dominion of Canada, and being composed of the South East quarter of Section Thirty-two of the said Township, being land and land covered by water, as shown upon a map or plan of survey of the said Township, approved and confirmed at Ottawa, on the 30th day of August, A. D. 1913 by Edouard Deville, Surveyor General of Dominion Lands, and of record in the Department of the Interior.

containing by admeasurement

together one hundred and sixty

acre, more or less;

SAVING AND RESERVING, NEVERTHELESS, unto Us, Our Successors and Assigns, the free uses, passage and enjoyment of, in, over and upon all navigable waters that now are or may be hereafter found on or under, or flowing through or upon any part of the said Parcel or Tract of Land; also reserving all mines and minerals, whether solid, liquid or gaseous, which may be found to exist within, upon or under such lands, together with full power to work the same, and for this purpose to enter upon, use and occupy the said lands or so much thereof and to such extent as may be necessary for the effectual working and extracting of the said minerals; and also reserving thereout and therefrom all rights of fishery and fishing and occupation in connection therewith upon, around and adjacent to the said lands, and also the privilege of landing from and mooring boats and vessels upon any part of the said lands and using the said lands in connection with the rights of fishery and fishing hereby reserved, so far as may be reasonably necessary to the exercise of such rights.

To have and to hold the same unto the grantee, in fee simple.

Provided, and it is hereby declared, that these presents shall not vest in the grantee any exclusive or other property or interest in or any exclusive right or privilege with respect to any lake, river, spring, stream, or other body of water, within or bordering on or passing through the aforesaid lands, or in, or with respect to the water contained or flowing therein, or the land forming the bed or shore thereof.

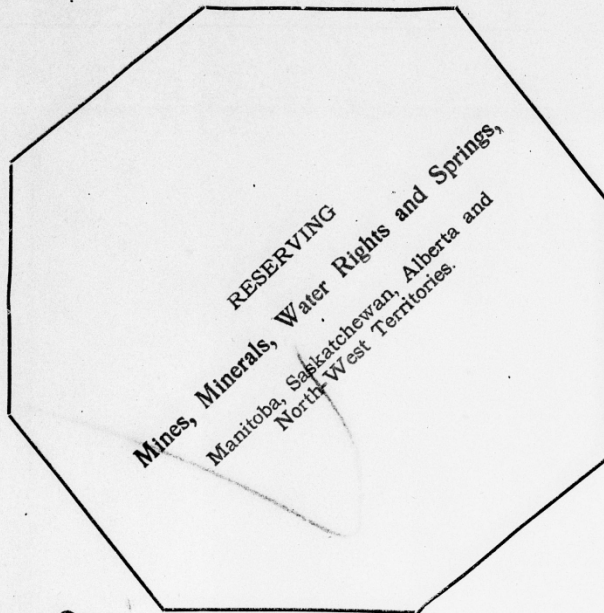
