DOROTHY DANDRIDGE SOCK CHIRP AT LA VIE EN ROSE

NEW YORK — Viewers of beautiful Dorothy Dandridge, in complete command of the plush stage at the La Vie En Rose, here last week left wondering what they had done for entertainment in the year since she'd been around before.

NAME ASSOCIATE PRODUCER FOR "JOE LOUIS STORY"

New York—William F. Joyce has been signed as associate producer of "The Joe Louis Story," it was announced this week by Stirling Silliphant, the film's producer.

Joyce has long been closely associated with Louis de Rochemont and was directly responsible for the production management of "Walk East on Beacon," "Lost Boundaries" and "Whistle at Eaton Falls", in addition to fifty other films.

He recently announced his resignation from the de Rochemont organization to launch his own company, Motion Picture Technique, Inc., an engineering and production management group to work with Hollywood producers shooting on live locations in the East.

"The Joe Louis Story" will be the first feature accepted by Joyce's group as a project. Time-saving pre-production planning, complete breakdown of locations and movement of operations have already been worked out by Motion Picture Techniques for the Silliphant indie production.

The picture began shooting on the 9th of March.

NEGRO BISHOP NAMED IN SOUTH AFRICA

Capetown, South Africa — The first native African Bishop of the hierarchy of Southern Africa has been named by His Holiness Pope Pius XII. He is Msgr. Emmanuel Mabathoana, who becomes Bishop of

the newly created diocese of Leribe in the British protectorate of Basutoland.

Basutoland is a native enclave surrounded by the Union of South Africa, but not belonging to the Union. About 250,000 of its 600,000 population are Catholics. The new diocese

has a Catholic population of about forty thousand.

Bishop-elect Mabathoana is the second of eleven Basutos who have been ordained to the priesthood. He is a great-great-grandson of a Basuto chief.

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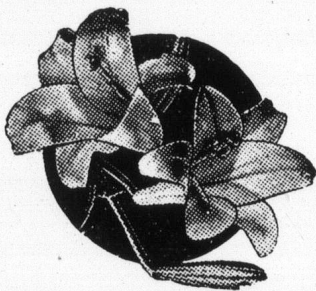
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
