2. Non-discrimination con tracts: promote non-discrimination policies in church and synagogue building and service contracts.


3. Depositing funds in ethical institutions: promote a policy of deposting and investing church and synagogue funds in financial institutions with ethical and moral policies on race.

In another action, the Chicago Conference authorized the Executive Committee to appoint one or more persons to serve as a liaison between the Chicago Conference and the Coordinating Council of Community Organizations

The Coordinating Council consists of various organizations active in the civil rights field and its purpose is to serve as a medium of communication between the groups so that each organization knows the plans and activities of the other.
