

BOMB HOME OF BOYCOTT MINISTER

Montgomery, Ala. — (INS) —The bombing of the home of a white minister who has supported the Negro boycott of buses in Montgomery Saturday aroused fresh feeling in Montgomery.

Police Capt. E. P. Brown said the blast damaged the front of the home of the Rev. Robert Graetz, a white Lutheran minister, who has a Negro congregation. The Rev. Graetz was out of town at the time.

The explosion according to Brown, ripped out windows, damaged the door of the house and blew a hole in the front yard. It also blew out windows in a home across the street. Brown said it apparently was caused by two or three sticks of dynamite.

Graetz has been an active member of the Montgomery Improvement Association, the group supporting the Negro bus boycott, which started last December, when a Negro woman was arrested after refusing to move to the segregated section in the back of the bus.

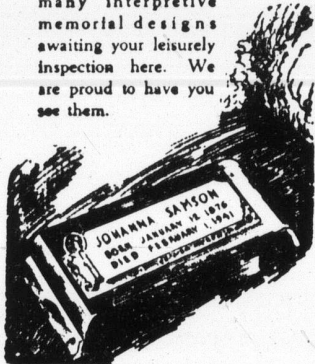

FEES

A registration fee of \$2.50 (which includes accident insurance) is payable at the time of registration. The fee for swimming is \$5.00 per term—October to December; January to March

School Terms and Sessions—The Fall term opens October 1st and closes December 17th. The Winter term opens on January 3rd and closes March 29th. If there is sufficient demand, any class may be continued beyond the closing date in March. The classes ordinarily are held two evenings a week from 7:30 to 9:30 o'clock. Certain classes, such as Art, Crafts and Dressmaking are held one evening a week from 7:00 to 10:00 o'clock.

Registration—Since the accommodation in some departments of the school is limited, students should enroll on the dates indicated above. However, additional registration will be accepted at any evening session commencing October 1st, 1956.

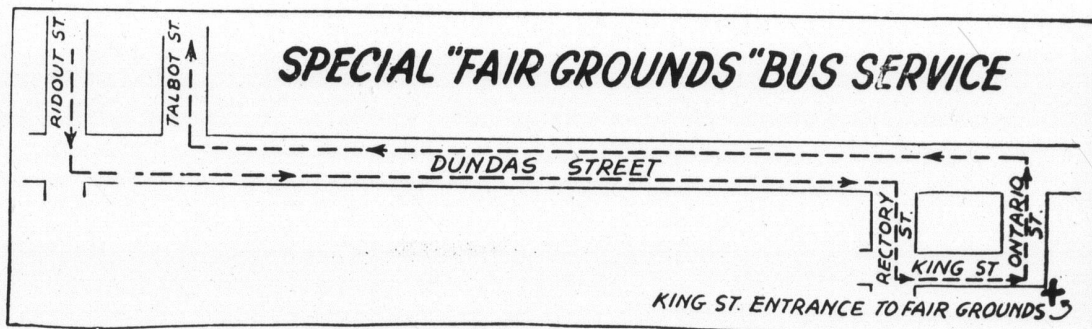
