Today we are proud our editorial
in the November edition has brought
about enough consideration that the
University of Toronto has decided
that in this school, discrimination
has no place. Another example of
discrimination happened in the case
of Leon Beard of Trinidad, a student
now studying at the University of
Toronto, who was denied the privi-
lege of playing in the annual Ontario
Bridge tourney conducted by a Tor-
onto club. We are also grateful to
Mr. John McBirnie, president of the
Students' Council who has taken up
our cause and the students in general
as they voted so SOLIDLY against
this practice. In my recent editorial
I stressed that if this measure was
taught to the boys and girls through
the school, these men, and women
of tomorrow would in truth have a
better world, a more harmonious
world and a better understanding of
each other.

As I said before many of our group
have made the same sacrifice to win
this second world war as they did
in the first world war. What are
these sacrifices for if at every op-
portunity we are told we are an in-
ferior people. In my estimation
there are no inferior people, but an
inferior person, he or she, does not
represent any race of people, and
only inferior because they choose to
make themselves so.

It is most disgusting at times to
learn from students attending some
of our schools to find speakers will
refer to the term "nigger in the wood-
pile"—or teachers make remarks
that the Negro boy is lazy and good
to step dance or strum a banjo, and
the girls to make good mummies to
English girls' babies. It's time the
heads of all schools awaken and
know the topic of an address to be
given a student body, also to teach-
ers who have the habit of wise-
cracking for the fun of seeing a stu-
dent squirm, and laughed at. When
I hear these things, I wonder if these
people have so soon forgotten Booker
T. Washington, Paul Lawrence, Dun-
bar, the late Dr. G. Carver. I could
go on and on. It would be good for
all races of people if the school would
have a history of some of these men
used more frequently. It would help
build up the morale of all races of
people.

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
