Founded by Persian

Baha'i Faith came into existence in its own right in 1853. Prior to that, in 1844, its coming was heralded by a Persian known as the Bab, meaning the "Gate." Founder of the faith was Baha'u'llah, also a Persian, which translated means "Glory of God." Its teachings are based upon the principles of the oneness of mankind, the unity of religions and justice without prejudice.
