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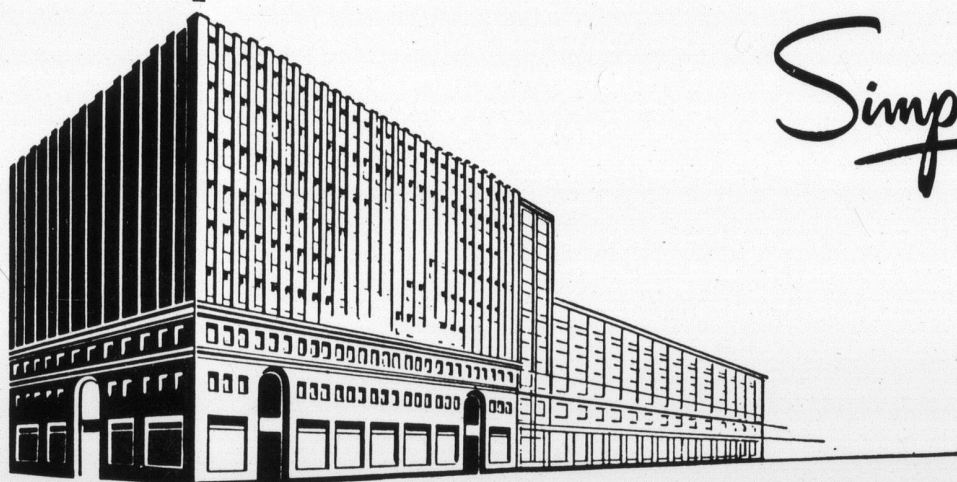

Says Canada Sets Church

UNION CITY, N.J. — The Canadian Conference of Roman Catholic Bishops has urged the federal government to sponsor religious education in Canada. The bishops produced a "successful experiment in church-state cooperation for education purposes." The Sign, a Catholic magazine, in its April issue published today.

"Church and state in Canada learned long ago to co-operate to support college education and the good of the country," the magazine cites the "for almost three quarters of a century" of successful experience.

"How this experience works, how it is financed, how it has affected education throughout Canada — these are matters of food for thought for Canadians. Catholics are beating their heads against Thomas Jefferson's 'separation' and with the difficulties of growing college enrollment and spiraling costs," the magazine asserts.

"Conducted by the Canadian Fathers, St. Michael's is one of the most distinguished Catholic liberal arts schools in North America," reports the Sign. "As part of the University of Toronto, a secular school, it is giving much of its credit to the province."
