
Dr. Bynoe has been district medical officer of the 133square-mile island for the past three years. Before this, she was in the Trinidad-Tobago health service.

Dr. Bynoe's father, Joseph T. Gibbs, is president of the Grenada senate. Her mother died when she was a young girl, and she has one sister.

Miss Bynoe said her uncle is "with his wife all the way" with regards to her new appointment, and is even relinquishing his government post in Trinidad to move with her to Grenada where she will be governor. Miss Bynoe expects he will set up an architectural practice there.

The London teacher received news of the appointment from her own family, who also live in Trinidad. Her 22-year-old brother will be studying business and ministration at McGill University this fall.

She will be returning to the West Indies at the end of June and will return to London in September to resume
