

EDMONTON (CP) — A federal grant of \$288,755 has been made to the Peigan Indian band at Brocket, Alta., 50 miles west of Lethbridge, under a new program designed to give Indians more con trol over their own affairs, an Indian affairs spokesman said Monday.

Under the band grants program, the Indian affairs department turns the funds over to bands for administration of services in which the department was formerly directly involved.

Ralph Ragan, department regional director for Alberta, called the program "the biggest step in getting Indian people to look after some of their own programs."

"It's just a matter of time before the bands become just like municipalities," he said.

The grant provides money for welfare, some road building, administration of a garbage dump, fire protection and repairs to housing.
