Today — after more than seven years on the Death Row of Louisiana prisons-37-yearold Edgar Labat and his co-defendant, Clifton Poret, are still fighting a grim, unpublicized battle—a battle that may well break Chessman's deathcell record.

On November 12, 1950, Labat was arrested in New Orleans and charged with assisting Poret in a crime most of than murder—the rape of a white woman.

Since that time, according to an article in the current issue of Look Magazine, Labat has been continuously in custody. For over seven years, he and Poret have been in death cells—at present a room six-feet wide and 10 feet long. For 14 months, they were in solitary confinement.

They have received eight stays of execution, one of them less than three hours before they were to be strapped in the electric chair. Their case has moved through the courts a dozen times.
