## WEST INDIANS LOOK FOR BRITISH AID

NEW YORK—British West Indians in the United States will call upon England to take definite action to frustrate Mussolini in the attempt to subjugate Ethiopia, according to the West Indian Federation of America, which will hold a mass meeting Monday evening in P.S. 136, at 135th Street and Edgcombe Avenue.

The federation, which welds the influence of hundreds of smaller societies among British West Indians here hopes also that other subjects throughout the world will make similar demands on England and France. Headquarters of the federation are at 157 W. 132nd Street. Miss Florence England is secretary.

### Emperor Responsive

In a cable reply to a message which pledged him the support of 300,000 members of the American League against was and Fascism and the Provisional Committee for the Defence of Ethiopia the Emperor expressed appreciation for the aid.

Saturday the league and the provisional committee will stage another demonstration in front of the Italian Consulate, 134 E. 70th Street. So far the consul has refused to meet a committee and has referred all callers on the subject to the Italian ambassador in Washington.

Since press reports that it is illegal to mobilize persons, in the United States for a foreign war, recruiting for Abyssinia has not been pushed openly however, the interest is still at fever heat.

## HOLD MAN OF 75 ON SERIOUS CHARGE

OMAHA, Nebr. (ANP)—Horace W. Jones, 75-year-old white man, has been held in District court under a \$1000 bond, for the rape of a 12-year old colored girl.

Before the attempted rape was discovered, the mother of the child had become suspicious of Jones because of the old man's frequent and abundant gifts of money, eggs, vegetables and other things to the girl.

When the girl returned from Jones' home, June 29, the mother had her examined by Dr. Westley Jones who stated that rape had been attempted.

The case will be prosecuted by the local branch of the NAACP, of which Dr. Jones is president and John Adams Jr., attorney, chairman of the legal redress committee.
