THE BIG FIGHT

"Joe Louis" and Max Schmeling are contestants on Thursday night's main event at the Kankee Stadium, the winner of which will meet Champion James J. Braddock for the heavy-weight title.

Max Schmeling, age 29, of Germany known as the "Black Uhlan" lost the crown to Jack Sharkey in 1932.

Joe Louis, Detroit's Brown Bomber age 22, outstanding graduate of the Golden Gloves, has been fighting professionally since 1934 and has never been defeated. In twenty-six bouts he has knocked out twenty-three, including such men as Max Baer, King Levinsky, Primo Carnera, and other aspirants.

Louis has been training in earnest and his trainers have every confidence that he will be victorious over Schmeling.

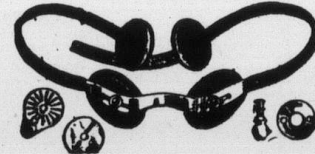
