The New York urban league expresses its belief that the resources of commerce and industry can and must be mobilized toward equal opportun-

In addition to having named the first black vice-president of a major American company, Pepsi-Cola has increased the responsibility of other black executives including two more vice-presidents. It has given strong support to minority business through distributorships controlled by minority group members, and increased purchasing from minority suppliers. It has pioneered with an advertising campaign on behalf of 24 blacgowned businesses, with fullpage ads at no cost to the black firms.

Pepsi-Cola has experimented in developing audio-visual materials on black history provided to educators across the country. To Pepsi-Cola as sumbolic of the business community, the New York urban league looks for new and further creative approaches in the decade ahead.
