es against the gun-powder of Europe were not only more economical to slavetraders, but more comforting to slaveholders: they were easier to control and keep than white slaves, in a country dominated by white slaveholders. So that the poor whites were gradually pushed out of the slave position and into "the hills." By the Civil war time, there were several thousand slaveholders in America; in Louiana they organized a regiment to help the Confederates.

There are many things which racial and national history does not bring out about the Negro: That next to the American Indian, the Negro is the oldest American people,—for the blacks stopped coming to America just at the beginning of the Civil war, when the last slave ship got through into Mobile: whie the whites have mostly come into America since the Civil War closed. In the years preceding the World war, the whites came in to the number of one million and five hundred thousanda year. All the fifteen million Negroes are therefore descendants of Africans who came before 1860; and the most of the whites are from Europeans who arrived after

The Negro today, as one tenth of the poplation, is the smallest part of the people he has ever been since he came here; during colonial days he would be as much as 45 black to 55 whites in some of the colonies, and was a large part of the total non-Indian population of the English settlements. Even at the close of the Civil war, the Negro was 13 to 14 per cent of the total people.


