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Party Ideas For Easter

Dress up eggs with gems, decals. Springtime and time for a party, and what dimpled little girl wouldn't be thrilled beyond measure to be hostess at an Easter Egg party. Mother will bake and frost the cake and make the sodas, but the junior miss can assume almost all responsibility for dyeing and decorating eggs.

First, she will start with clean, fresh, white hard-cooked eggs. Then in pyrex bowls she will dissolve the coloring tablets in hot water and add a teaspoon of vinegar. After the eggs are colored (and check to see that the Easter Egg kit contains certified food colors) she can decorate some of them with decals, multicolor glitter and egg dress-ups.

Decorate your party cake with some of the gay little figures which come in a circus kit. These are on a perforated sheet and children can easily punch them out, assemble and place colored eggs in the openings which form part of the bodies.

ST. JAMES PUDDING

1 cup molasses
1 cup sour milk
1 cup suet
1 tsp. soda
2 cups flour
1 tsp. cinnamon
1 tsp. ginger
1/2 tsp. salt
Blend molasses, sour milk and suet. Add sifted dry ingredients and pour into shallow 1 1/2 quart baking dish or pudding pan.

Steam 1 hour. (If you use a deep dish, use one with a tube in the centre, or steam for an extra half-hour to be sure pudding is done.)

FLUFFY SAUCE

1 cup brown sugar, packed
2 tbsp. soft butter
2 eggs, separated
1 tsp. vanilla
Mix sugar, butter, egg yolks and vanilla well.
Beat egg whites stiff and fold into sugar mixture.

Learn Now Pay Later

DES MOINES — (UPI) — Educators throughout the country are eyeing Grinnell College's "learn now, pay later" plan for helping lower-income families finance a college education.

Howard R. Bowen, president of the 930-student college at Grinnell, Iowa, has received hundreds of letters from school officials inquiring about the installment plans. Grinnell plans to put the program into effect next September.

In one plan, regular monthly payment and billing carry no interest charges, but do have \$1 per month "service fee" to cover the cost of bookkeeping and billing.

For example, a student enters college, faced with paying \$1,850, the yearly cost for tuition and dormitory space. Assuming a \$200 scholarship or grant-in-aid and a small down payment, the student would be left with a balance of \$1,335. This would be divided into 12 payments of \$111.25 plus the monthly service fee.

A second plan spreads the cost of a four-year college course across a longer period of time. This is called an extended payment plan.

Bowen explained that under this method, payments can be extended from five to eight years.

For example, Bowen said a student's costs for four years at the school would come to \$7,400. Assuming certain scholarships or other tuition remission devices, the balance would come to \$5,640.

In this plan, Bowen explained, a small interest charge is added to monthly payments, in addition to the \$1 service fee.

Total monthly payments would be \$100.47 per month for five years, including an interest rate on the total amount of money, slightly more than one per cent.

Bowen said the payment plans are operated on a non-profit basis. Extra charges are aimed at reimbursing the college for its cost in administering the programs.

When parents wish to use an eight-year payment plan, the contract calls for payments to begin one year before the student enters college.

To protect the school, a parent using the extended payment plan must purchase an insurance policy which guarantees the college payment in case of the breadwinner's death.

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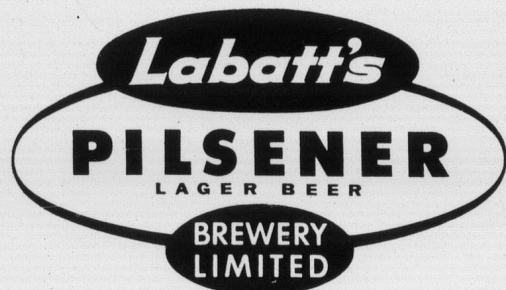
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
