

Rev. Iliad Hazelton Edwards Well-Known Minister Passes

Rev. Iliad Hazelton Edwards, well-known British Methodist Episcopal Minister and former Windsor Board of Education employee died at his residence, 916 Windsor Avenue, Windsor, Ont., on September 2.

Born in Brownstown, Jamaica, Mr. Edwards received his Bachelor of Arts degree from St. Michael's College, Kingston, Jamaica. He also studied theology at Hope University, Jamaica, and earned his Bachelor of Literature degree from Oskaloosa College, Oskaloosa, Iowa.

Having studied the organ and violin under Professor Preeze in Jamaica, Mr. Edwards was the organist at Brownstone Methodist Church and at St. Michael's College. He also taught school in Warsop and Gibraltar, Jamaica.

After coming to Canada in 1910 Mr. Edwards settled in Toronto and attended the B.M.E. Church. He was ordained in 1913 at the B.M.E. Church in Toronto and served B.M.E. Churches in Niagara Falls, Ont., and Fort Erie.

In 1919 Mr. Edwards came to Windsor and was minister at the Windsor B.M.E. Church until 1926. In 1945 Mr. Edwards served Amherst-

burg, Harrow and London B.M.E. Church until 1950. In 1950 Mr. Edwards returned to Windsor B.M.E. Church where he remained until his death.

He was buried from the B.M.E. Church, University and Louis Avenues, Windsor.

Rev. E. A. Richardson,

pastor and Dr. Alex Marcham, of Toronto, general Supt. of the B.M.E. Conference and Rev. Geo. Crawford of Brantford officiated.

Burial was made in Windsor Grove Cemetery.

He left to mourn his loss a wife and son, and one sister, and a host of friends.
