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Episcopalians Endorse Birth Control Policy

MILWAUKEE — The National Council of the Episcopal (Anglican) Church overwhelmingly endorsed birth control measures as a means of "relieving problems of population growth."

The statement adopted by the council affirmed its support of birth control resolutions adopted by the 1958 Lambeth Conference of the World Anglican Communion in London.

Liberia Acts Through Courts

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y.—Liberia last week took direct action to halt South Africa's refusal to give an accounting of its trusteeship for the South West Africa territory.

The territory, formerly controlled by Germans, was placed under South Africa's administration by the League of Nations in 1920. Since then, South Africa has refused to account to the United Nations on its handling of the region.

Last week, Liberia recommended that the matter be placed in the hands of the International Court of Justice. Miss Angie R. Brooks, assistant secretary of state for Liberia, made the recommendation.

The Rt. Rev. Stephen F. Bayne, bishop of Olympia, Wash., criticized the Roman Catholic Church's opposition to birth control as "faulty moral theology."

Bishop Bayne will take office January 1 as the new executive officer of the World Anglican Communion.

Give Contraceptives
In New York, a Protestant church disclosed that one of its hospitals is conducting tests with oral contraceptives in predominantly Roman Catholic Puerto Rico.

The project was described in a quarterly report by Dr. Truman B. Douglas, executive vice-president of the Congregational Christian Board of Home Missions.

He criticized U. S. public officials for their "hands-off policy" on the population problem, and the Roman Catholic Church for its opposition to birth control aid. He said:

"It's time for the church to realize that God cares more for the release of human beings from suffering and despair than he cares for the preservation of ancient dogma."

The report said that the Ryder Hospital project, begun in 1957, has involved 450 women, with 300 at present taking the contraceptive pills. None of those taking the pills as directed has become pregnant, the report said.

Eat Lightly Enjoy Season

Sainfoin, or "Holy Hay," is said to have cradled the infant Christ in the manger. The snowdrop is the flower of the Virgin Mary, and is said to be the emblem of the candles she lighted on Christmas.

According to legend, the Christmas rose was divinely created. A shepherd maid wept at having no gift to lay before the Babe in the manger. Suddenly an angel appeared to her. On hearing why the maiden wept, the angel touched the ground where her tears had fallen and immediately the place was white with Christmas roses, which the maid gathered and laid in the manger.

The chrysanthemum is said to have appeared first on Christmas Eve near the manger as a sign to the Wise Men that they had reached the spot where the star had bidden them.
