Carl T. Rowan, award-winning newspaperman and author, tells why in his article, "What Faubus Did For EBONY Magazine.

Rowan points out that while Faubus attempted to appease segregationists the results have helped the Negro with action by the federal government and world moral opinion. Seeing the youngsters heroically facing mob violence has given the Negro a deeper sense of pride and determination, and has also put segregationists on the defensive.

"Thus", author Rowan says, 'ne might say that Orval Faubus has shocked the nation into a realization that in this period of racial change, 'trouble' may mean progress whereas peaceful do-nothingness means stagnation and decay".

#### Civil Rights Bill Paced Progress in '57

CHICAGO, ILL.—The biggest advance of the year for the American Negro came from Congress in 1957 when the first civil rights bill since Reconstruction was passed, according published each year.

School integration proceeded without incident in some areas while in others violence and hatred flared. The infamous Little Rock incident gained

At year's end, 751 school districts out of 2,985 in southern and border states had desegregated. West Virginia became the first state to end segregation in all of its districts. On the college level, integration was proceeding in increasingly large num-

According to EBONY, the dominant influence of the year was the mood of the Negro, which was reflected in biggest civil rights demonstration ever staged by American Negroes.

Other advances in Negro progress included sports where Althea Gibson became the first Negro to win major women's tennis titles, and Hank Aaaron who led the Milwaukee Braves to their first pennant. In politics Archibald Carey Jr., was named chairman of the President's Committee on Government Employment Policy. Several Negroes were elected to new city council posts.

For Negro actors and entertainers 1957 was a banner year, including starring movie roles, broadway
