NAACP LAWYER CITES PRECEDENT FOR SAVING FRANCIS

New Orleans, La., Jan. 14th —New hope that the life of Willie Francis, 17, condemned a second time to die in the electric chair in Louisiana, may yet be spared, came today from A. P. Tureaud, NAACP lawyer here. Speaking for the Association, Mr. Tureaud today wired Governor J. H. David, pointing out that on April 23, 1921, Governor Parker set a precedent when he commuted to life imprisonment one Lonnie Eaton, whose execution date had been forgotten by the sheriff of Ouachita parish. Stating that a second attempt to execute Willie Francis would be "cruel and unusual punishment," Mr. Tureaud urged the Governor to commute his death sentence to life imprisonment.

NAACP Barred from Case says Walter White.

In a statement today, Walter White executive secretary, NAACP, said that the Association had been barred from the Willie Francis case by the lawyer selected by Francis' father, who told Mr. White, following the failure of the first electrocution, that he preferred handling the case himself and did not want the advice proffered by the Association at that time.

However, when the Supreme Court by a five to four vote, upheld the decision of the State of Louisiana, Francis' lawyer sent the Association a telegram demanding that he be given a large sum of money to file a further appeal.

Said Mr. White: "It should be clearly understood that the NAACP is in nowise responsible for the legal handling of the case, although in every way possible, it is attempting to arouse public opinion to get the Governor of Louisiana to be merciful and commute Willie Francis' sentence to life."

Toronto, Jan. 27 — (CP) — Two Canadians who have been appointed to teaching positions in Ethiopia by the Ethiopian Government will fly to Africa shortly to take over their new posts.

They are Mr. and Mrs. Stewart Phoenix, formerly of London and Mount Pleasant, Ont., and presently of Toronto.

Mr. Phoenix, formerly on the staff of Mount Pleasant Continuation School, will be teacher of practical agriculture in the School of Agriculture at Jimma, Ethiopia.

Mrs. Phoenix, a graduate in home economics from MacDonald Hall, in Guelph, will teach practical arts in the Government Girls' School, also at Jimma. She is the former Jean Guest.

The young people are taking their infant son, Leigh, with them.
