NAACP OFFICIAL APPOINTED
TO STUDY POLICE BRUTALITY

New York, Nov. 13—Police Commissioner Arthur W. Wallender today appointed Madison S. Jones, NAACP administrative assistant to a committee which will co-operate with high police officials in the city's current investigation into charges of police brutality and discriminatory practices.

At a meeting in the Police Commissioner's office on Wednesday, November 12th, Mr. Jones strongly urged that the police department immediately institute a program of indoctrination both in the police academy and in refresher courses for New York's patrolmen in equitable treatment and democratic attitudes toward the city's many racial and religious groups. Mr. Jones also pointed out the fact that every citizen, regardless of race or creed had a right to frequent any section of the city at any time, provided his business was legitimate. He then urged that reported cases of police brutality and increasing intimidation be investigated thoroughly.

Other members of the committee Rev. John H. Johnson, Edward Lewis, of the Urban League; Parole Commissioner Samuel Battles and a representative of the Negro Press.
