orbs improvements to the pewson sirport were cerried out in accordance with suggestions received from for. 1. D. McLeen, Acting superintendent of Airways of the Repartment of civil aviation, who made an inspection of this field in company with the eriter in July, 1935. Perticular attention was paid to the lending strip. The coerage meterial in the gravel which was used for surfacing during the previous year, and which had come to the surface, was removed. The pressions which had formed throughout the full length were levelled and finer gravel mixed with sub-soil was used. The result was that a leading strip one handred feet in width the full length of the field was obtained level throughout the full length. The belonce of the field was levelled for a width of two hundred feet on each side of the lending strip. all depressions filled, and the whole field was rolled. A ditch of sufficient depth was made at the edge of the field on each side, the full length, to drain off water at the period of the spring thaw.

A circle was placed at center of the field for a marker, with outside dismotor one hundred foot, band four feet in width, and colour white. Fine white channel gravel was hauled and used for this purpose.

Equipment used in doing work on the field consisted of two trators, a grader, self leading scraper, gas powered loader, dump vagons, a dump truck, drag and roller, all the property of the form torial Government.
