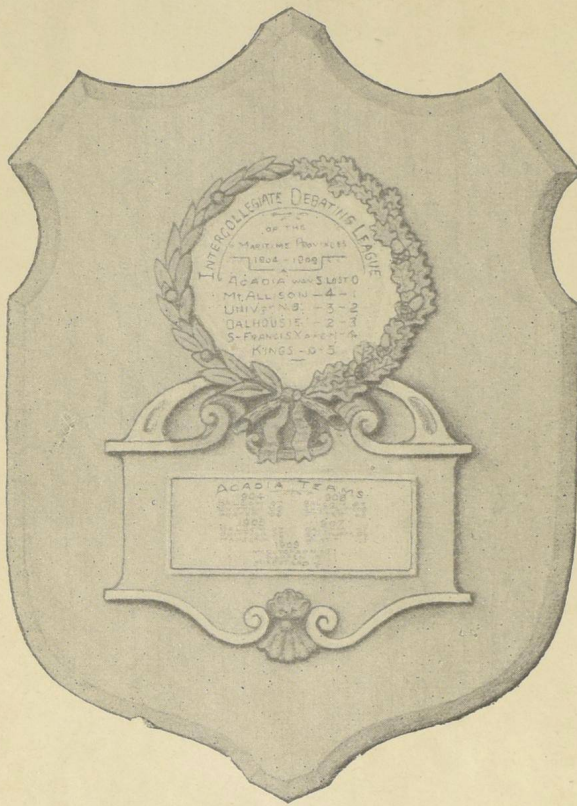




THE above cut is a miniature reproduction of the tablet erected by the Athenæum Society to commemorate Acadia's success in winning the first cycle of the Maritime Intercollegiate Debating League. The base of the tablet is a shield of quartered oak upon which are laid two silver plates. On the upper plate is engraved the record of the cycle of debates, indicating the names of the competing colleges and the number of debates won and lost by each. Acadia leads with five victories and not a single defeat. Upon the lower plate is engraved the names of the members of the five teams who upheld the honor of Acadia in these contests. Encircling these plates is an ornamental bronze relief, the upper part of which is a wreath of oak and laurel leaves. The tablet, as a whole, is noble in appearance, and a fit commemoration of the honors won by the Acadia teams.
