I wish to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 9th instant, with reference to the application of Alex. Chief, No. 1019, of the Pequis Band, to secure an additional 12 acres of land, which he claims was due him and he did not receive at the time of the St. Peters surrender. I have carefully gone into the early records of the Department and regret that I have been unable to locate any reference to the matter under consideration. I would suggest, however, that you communicate with Mr. J. R. Bunn, Inspector of Indian Agencies, 4th Floor Commercial Bulding, Winnipeg, Manitoba, as the correspondence records with reference to St. Peters surrender and location of the Indians (1st in his office.
