Applications for Sittings should be made to Deacon Jas. McPherson. The seats are assigned, not rented. Each holder of a sitting is expected to be a contributor.

THIS CHURCH IS SUPPORTED by the voluntary contributions of the people. Regulations, Rules, and Motions governing Sittings in the North Baptist Church.

The following were considered and adopted at the regular business meeting held March 5th, 1901, and ordered to be printed in the "Church Calendar."

1st. *Resolved*, That the seats shall be under the control of a Pew Committee, consisting of *three* members of the Church.

2nd. Seats shall be allotted, not rented.

3rd. Persons to whom pews or sittings are allotted shall have same on condition that they contribute to the current expense by envelope regularly, and also occupy the sitting unless prevented by some good reason.

4th. In case of failure on the part of any pewholder to comply with the conditions of Rule 3, the seat will be regarded as having been vacated.

5th. All strangers and persons who are not regular attendants will be cordially welcomed, and seated by the ushers.
