The UNB War Memorial Fund has grown to a total exceeding \$154,000. Dr. A. F. Van Wart, Chairman of the Central Committee revealed to the Brunswickan at press time. The purpose of the campaign which is being conducted is to convert the Memorial Building to a Memorial Student Cen-


The number of Alumni and Alumnae who have contributed to the fund to date is in excess of 1100, it was also learned. At the same time, Dr. Van Wart pointed out that Canadian Corporations had generously supported their Alma Mater's financial

campaign, as had the student body which last year contributed a total of \$2000, to the fund.

Expressing satisfaction with the progres sto date, Dr. VanWart stated that blocks of returns are still expected. Every effort is being made he added, to bring the campaign to a successful conclusion. The campaign objective is \$250,000.
