BANK DIRECTORS—PERFORMING THEIR DUTIES TOO WELL.

The directors of the Federal and Dominion banks respectively, it is said, have been borrowing bank money and lending it on stocks. It is charged against them that what the law will not allow to be done directly they have been doing indirectly.

From the days of the old bank of Upper Canada to the recent time when the Consolidated bank collapsed, what has been the prevailing popular judgment as to the chief cause of the various bank disasters, some great and some small, which have been experienced in Canada?

For the first time in thirty years the revenue of the United States post office department has been in excess of expenditure—by some \$1,394,385—and on this account it is proposed to reduce the postage of letters to two cents.

THE losses to operators in the oil regions by the late speculations are roughly estimated at five million dollars. The business of the oil country is terribly crippled.
