The lower ends of the blocks, resting on boards, clay or sand, soon become covered with an abund.

The Telephone Monopoly. Editor World: Your advocacy of reduced rates and other changes in the Bell Telephone system was in the right direction, but in the detail it was unjust and incomplete. It would be unfair to subscribers for the city to get a rebate on amount of fees. Sub-scribers have no obligation to perform that which should make them extra taxpayers, besides which the rate mentioned is much too high. 
