CHRONICLE.

BY R. R. BOGART.

ANTIOQUIA—We have seen another set of Provisionals from here: all have the value at top and bottom, and in the center in three lines, "R de Colombia—D de A—Provisional," surrounded by rectangular type set frames which differ in the different values, printed in black. 2½c. on buff; 5c. on yellow, 19c. on buff, 10c. on rose, 20c. on yellow. Perforated.

ARGENTINE REPUBLIC—There are new stamps 25c. violet with portrait of General Belgrano, and 50c. orange with General Mitre; also a letter card, 5c. red on blue, for the Minister of Justice, etc., with head of Rivadavia; and 4c. brown on white for the Vice-President, which conforms to the 4c. card in current use.

BAMRA—In addition to the 4a. and 8a. already announced, there are three pies, black on yellow; six pies, black on rose; 1a. black on blue; 2a. black on green, also an envelope of six pies, black on white, 185x64 and 113x67 mm.

BELGIUM—A 35c. stamp is expected.

BRITISH EAST AFRICA—The *Ill. Br. Journal* notes the 2d. and 5d. of Great Britain, surcharged in black, in three lines at the top, "British—East Africa—Company." The former is also surcharged across the value, "1 Anna," and the latter, "4 Annas."

BR. NORTH BORNEO—The 3, 8 and 10c. are reported with surcharge "Postage and Revenue."

CEYLON—The 4c. rose has again been surcharged; this time "Two cents," in thick small type. Registry envelopes of 15c. rose have appeared with stamp of the usual circular type. Three sizes.

COLOMBIA—*Der Ph.* notes unpaid letter stamps, with eagle in oval and inscribed "Franco de Porte—Provisional." 1c. black on blue; 2c. black on rose; 5c. black on yellow. Perf. 11½.

DUTCH INDIES—The 5c. and 12½c. are reported of the new type with figures of value in center.

FRANCE—The 75c. is dark violet on orange and the new 50c. has been surcharged "2 piastres 2."

FRENCH COLONIES—The 15c. is now blue on pink.

GREECE—Mr. Rechert informs us there is a new set in preparation with a representation of Mercury, after Praxiteles. There will be 2 and 4 drachme stamps.

HUNGARY—The 5kr. stamps on envelopes, cards and letter cards are now orange instead of carmine.

ITALY—The 50c. is also surcharged "20."

LUXEMBURG—The 5 and 10c. cards are now reduced slightly in size.

NEW ZEALAND—There is a 1d. card inscribed "Inland and Australian."

QUEENSLAND—*The Stamp News* notes the 1d. with error "Queensland," and the 1sh. violet, both with band of net-work on back.

ROUMANIA—There is a new 5c. card, black on rose; the stamp has large figure 5 in oval and the outer frame is a rectangle instead of an octagon as before.

RUSSIA—The 3 and 5 kop. now have thunderbolts and a 14 kop. of current type is reported, blue with pink center.

SAN MARINO—*Der Ph.* reports a letter card 20c. orange on yellow.

SCINDE—When in India, lately, Mr. Tapping obtained some specimens of these stamps, and among them were some on red glazed paper.

SEYCHELLES—The 48c. is brown (c. c. 96) and green instead of the colors noted in May.

TOBAGO—Some of our exchanges have just discovered the 1sh. green of first type with C. A. watermark. This was issued six years ago

and is a fiscal stamp only, although it would no doubt pay postage.

TURKEY—There are new colors as follows: 10pa. greenish gray, 20 pa. rose, 1pi. bluish gray, 2pi. yellow, 5 pi. flesh.

WESTERN AUSTRALIA—The *Ph. R.* notes a new 2d. stamp resembling the platypus stamp of Tasmania with swan in center. This is gray, wmk. C. A., perf. 14.

JAPANESE STAMPS.

YOKOHAMA, JAPAN, June 14th, 1890.

To the Editor of The American Journal of Philately.

DEAR SIR,—In the interest of stamp collectors and dealers, I consider it my duty to place the following facts before your readers:

This morning a Japanese called upon me with samples of 19 different Japanese stamps, viz.: 1871 issue, 48-100-200 and 500 Mon. 1872 issue, $\frac{1}{2}$ -1, 2 and 5 sen (type same as the 1871 issue), also 10, 20, and 30 sen of same year; 1873 issue, 6 sen, purple brown; 1875 issue, 10, 12, 15, 20, 30, and 45 sen; 1876

issue 5 sen. green. He represented that he had from 90 to 400 of each, aggregating about 2,900; they had the appearance of being genuine, and were all cancelled in perfect imitation of the crude style of cancelling in vogue in most of the Post Offices at the time these stamps were current. These stamps have been very scarce here for years past and latterly it has been very difficult to find a dozen of any one of them at one time, so the quantity this party had, excited my suspicion, and fortunately I examined them much closer than I otherwise would have done, and found that every one of them were bogus.

As these stamps are such very clever imitations, it will be a difficult matter for any one who has no genuine stamps to compare with to decide whether they are genuine or bogus; the only difference that I noted was, in the workmanship the imitations are not quite so finely engraved. I would therefore advise purchasers to buy these old issues only from reputable dealers who are willing and able to guarantee all the stamps they sell.

EXCHANGE DEPARTMENT.

While in New York at the A. P. A. Convention Mr. E. B. Sterling, Supt of A. P. A. Exchange, informed me that the system of giving credits to owners of sheets as soon as sales from their books were reported, had proved a failure. Almost all the debtors wished to put off payment as long as possible, awaiting new credit balances to clear them of their indebtedness. This system gave him no end of trouble, as it involved a large amount of calculations and increased correspondence. The members who patronize the Ex. Dept. may be classified in four divisions, each class having a different object in view. First, those who put in stamps solely for the purpose of selling, not exchanging. They take no stamps and want immediate cash. Second, those who put in a few common stamps, take very liberally from all Ex. Books they get, and when semi-annual account is rendered and balance found against them, want to know why their stamps had not found a better sale, and send in some more cheap stamps, with which they expect the Supt. to pay off their debt. Third, a few who put no stamps in exchange but pay prompt cash, when called upon. Fourth, a few who send in a large amount of stamps and take exchange for it all. The interests of the first, third and fourth classes harmonize with the interests of the Association, but it is the second class that creates all the trouble. At the last C. P. A. Convention some changes in the working of the Ex. Dept. were adopted; a limit of \$3 on each sheet; exchange Books to be sent only to those who furnish stamps, or make a cash deposit, or give first class reference. The Supt. will not have first choice, as before. I am now ready to receive any number of filled

sheets, which will be circulated to best advantage.

We have just met with a new and dangerous forgery of this stamp. A used 1d. black is taken and the top letters taken out, probably with acid; the texture of the paper appearing very rough under a strong glass. The letters V. R. are "then printed in." However, the letters are not carefully done, and a close examination shows that the junction of the bottom of the V instead of being at a sharp angle is blunt, the left side of the V running into the right side some slight distance from the bottom. The "R" has also a much more curly tail than in the genuine, and is also rather too wide at the bottom.—*Monthly Journal.*

Mr. T. S. Clark, of Belleville, writes: "The Philatelist Co., of New York, returned my subscription with the remark, "Many thanks for your notice in the Dominion Philatelist."

We give our readers some extracts of a report of the A. P. A. Convention forwarded to us by S. Allen Taylor, thinking it might be of interest to have a report of the Convention from one who was not there. "The Convention A. P. A. in New York is not quite over yet and the only news extant which has come to my knowledge is that the "Board of Trustees" have tried to count Corwin in over Van Derlip against the Constitution which provides that no two officers shall hail from the same State. The existence of not only forged postmarks and surcharges, but also forged stamps, are pretty well known to the large London collectors, but it will be news to many that certain collectors have been favoured with specimens of forged postmarks, not on stamps, but on pieces of paper. The New South Wales is the latest we have seen.

The forged Newfoundlands are dangerous enough, but the latest is the 1s. 9d Ceylon, for

which the makers actually procured the paper with star watermark.

A correspondent informs us that he has received some of these and other forgeries from Frederick Bloom, who writes from the East End of London, and also Tasmanian and other bogus stamps from some one giving another name and address.

It is no secret in London that many of these "fakes" (as they call them) come from the shop of Benjamin & Sarpy, and we think it time that it should be known as well outside the city. Of course there are others connected with them, but these are the prime movers, and openly admit it themselves.

Those who buy from these people are more to blame than the makers. If there was no market for such things, there would be no forgeries; and, either intentionally or from ignorance, the dealers in Germany, France and the United States are the best, if not the only customers of the dealers in bogus stamps. Last time Benjamin returned from America, there were complaints from New York; but we suppose he will again return with American dollars, in exchange for the rubbish he has taken over to our American cousins.—*Stamp News*.

THE SOUVENIR ISSUE OF GREAT BRITAIN.

The occasion of the Penny Postage Jubilee in London, has been officially recognized by the postal authorities, in issuing a special post card, with the usual stamp in the upper right corner, but having the additional imprints of the rose, shamrock and thistle in the upper left corner, with V. R., surmounted with a crown in the centre, above are the city arms and below the inscription in two lines, "Penny Postage Jubilee, 1890, Guildhall, London."

Only ten thousand of these cards were printed, and only ten were sold to each buyer.

There is also a very interesting souvenir in the form of an envelope and card, 15,000 of which were sold only on the 2nd of July at South Kensington Museum at the price of one shilling, the proceeds to go to a benevolent fund for the postal employees. Both envelope and card are printed in blue on white paper.

The envelope bears a penny stamp of the post-card issue of 1879, in the upper right corner, the rose, shamrock and thistle with V. R. surmounted by the crown in the upper left corner and in the upper centre the following inscription: "Post-Office Jubilee of Uniform Penny Postage, at South Kensington Museum, 2nd of July, 1890." Then the vignette of a four-horse mail coach with the words underneath: "The North Mail making for Highgate, 1790, at 8 miles an hour." In the lower left corner showing a postman of 1840, and rates 4d., 8d., 1s. 2d., 2s. 6d., and in the lower right corner a letter carrier of 1890, and the present rate, 1d. Below, running across the entire envelope, is a railway train, under which is the following inscription: "The North Mail, 1890, approaching Carlisle at 48 miles an hour."

The card, which is intended for the correspondence and to be enclosed in the envelope, has no stamp, but arms between V. R. and Penny Postage Jubilee, 1890, in two lines, surrounded by ornamental groundwork. On the left is the portrait of Sir Rowland Hill, in a plain frame, with the words, "He gave us penny postage." *Philatelic Monthly.*
