





#### STANDING RULES

FOR THE

#### CONSTITUTION AND GOVERNMENT

OF THE

### Newfoundland Church Society.

#### NAME.

1—The name of this Society shall be "THE NEWFOUNDLAND CHURCH SOCIETY."

#### OBJECTS.

2—The objects of this Society shall be, (1) to contribute towards the maintenance of the Clergy and Licensed Lay-Readers, (2) to assist in the erection, enlargement or repairs of Churches, Parsonages, or School-rooms, and in the purchase of land for Glebe or other Church purposes, (3) to provide for sale a supply of Bibles, Prayer Books, School Books, and other Religious Books and Tracts, (4) to assist in creating and sustaining a Special Fund for the endowment and support of the Theological College in St. John's, and (5) to create and maintain a separate Fund for assisting the Widows and Children of deceased Clergymen of this Diocese.

#### MEMBERS.

3—The members of this Society shall be, (1) all persons who shall have paid to their Clergyman or the Treasurer the two preceding years the annual sum of ten shillings for the objects of the Society; and (2) all Clergymen who shall have officiated in

Newfoundland or Labrador the two preceding years with the Bishop's license.

4.—All members shall have power to vote at the annual and other general meetings.

#### OFFICERS.

5—The officers of this Society shall be, (1) the Lord Bishop of the Diocese, President; (2) the Venerable the Archdeacon and the Rural Deans, Vice-Presidents; (3) a Treasurer; and (4) a Secretary; the last two to be chosen by the members of the Society at the annual general meeting; but in case of resignation of office, or removal of either Secretary or Treasurer, during the interval between two annual meetings, the Committee shall appoint a person to act in either case, until the next annual meeting.

#### MANAGERS.

6—The Committee of Management shall consist of the officers of the Society, and certain laymembers, elected as representatives in each of the Deaneries—viz., four elected by members of the Society resident in the Deanery of Avalon; three by members resident in the Deanery of Conception Bay; two by members resident in the Deanery of Trinity Bay; two by members resident in the Deanery of Bonavista Bay; three by members resident in the Deanery of Placentia Bay; and two by members resident in the Deanery of Fortune Bay.

7—The election of representatives shall be as follows:—On some day in Easter Week, in the

year 1859, and in every succeeding fourth year, a meeting of the members resident in each mission, shall be convened by the Clergyman in charge at some convenient hour and place, of which notice shall be given (with the Bishop's consent) in each Church in the mission on some Sunday in the previous month; at which meeting the Clergyman, or, in his absence, some other person then to be chosen by the members, shall preside, and the members present shall vote seriatim for the prescribed number of representatives.

8—When the voting, which may be continued, if necessary, six hours, but not longer, is completed, the Presiding Officer in each Mission shall report the result to the Rural Dean, and the persons who have obtained a majority of votes in the Deanery, shall be elected representatives; provided that every person to be a member of the Committee must be a Communicant of the Church of England.

9—The Rural Dean shall report the result of the election in his Deanery to the Secretary in St. John's, the first convenient opportunity.

10—The new representatives shall be convened by the Secretary at the Michaelmas quarterly meeting; until which time the former representatives shall continue in office.

11—As often as it shall become necessary, from the death, absence from the Colony, resignation, disqualification, or refusal to serve, of any of the representatives, to appoint another or others in their place, a special meeting of the

members, in the Deanery where the vacancy has arisen, shall (as soon as the Rural Dean, or, in his absence, the Clergyman next senior in standing in the Diocese, may in his discretion appoint) be convened in like manner as the Easter meeting, when the required representative or representatives shall in like manner be elected.

12—The President or a Vice-President, and six other members of the Committee shall be competent to manage the business at every meeting duly convened.

13—All Clergymen of the Diocese holding the Bishop's license, shall be ex officio honorary members of the Committee, with the right of speaking, but not, with the exception of the officers, of voting at its meetings.

#### TRUSTEE.

14—The Lord Bishop of the Diocese shall be the Trustee of this Society, and shall have power to let or to take houses or lands and to receive all rents and interest of monics as the same shall fall due, and shall pay the same to the Treasurer for the time being, taking his receipt, and handing it over to the Committee.

#### GENERAL MEETINGS.

15—An Annual General Meeting of the members and friends of the Society shall be holden in St. John's on the second Thursday after Trinity Sunday, or as soon after as the Bishop may appoint. The Secretary shall give notice to each of the Clergymen in St. John's, who shall publish it [with the Bishop's consent] in his Church on on the previous Sunday.

16—At the Annual General Meeting a report on the state of the Society, with the Treasurer's accounts, duly audited, shall be submitted by the Committee, to be printed, or otherwise, as shall be then and there determined by the members.

17—A special general meeting may be convened at any time [1] by the Presinent; [2] by a Vice-President and six members of the Committee, or [3] by any twelve members of the Society whose payments are not in arrear; provided notice of such meeting be duly given as in the case of annual general meetings.

18—The Chairman shall not vote at any general meeting, except in the case of an equality of votes.

#### COLLECTIONS.

19—It is expected that a collection for the various objects of the Society will be made every year by every Clergyman in the Diocese, from every head of a family and every adult member of the Church in his Mission, assisted if need be by his Churchwardens and other respectable members of his congregation.

20—Every Clergyman shall transmit to the Secretary a list of the contributors to the objects of the Society in his Missien, with the amount of their several payments, and to the Treasurer one-fourth at least of his whole collections, on or before the last day in every year, or as soon after as practicable.

N. B —This Rule does not apply to the Clergy of St. John's, who shall send in the whole of their collections to the Treasurer.

21—All Clergymen who have collected as far as possible from every head of a family, and from every adult Member of the Church in their Missions, towards the objects of the Society, for the two years immediately preceding, and who have remitted to the Treasurer one-fourth of the whole collections, shall be entitled to assistance from the funds of the Society towards any of its objects in their own Mission; provided that no Clergyman shall make a collection for his own maintenance separate from or independent of the general collections; and that pew-rents and assessments be not considered as part of the said collection or collections.

#### GRANTS.

- 22—It shall be the duty of the Committee to determine from time to time on the appropriation of the Funds, by making grants towards the objects of the Society under the recommendation and sanction of the President.
- 23—No Clergyman declining or neglecting to collect for the Society, or to transmit a list of the contributors, and their payments, and a fourth part of his collection (as directed in Rule 20) shall be entitled to receive any grants from the Society for himself, or for any of the objects of the Society, in his Mission; provided that where a collection has been duly made, and the list, with the fourth part of the collections, transmitted for the two previous years by his predecessor, any Clergyman newly in charge may, before sending his annual collections, ask and receive for any of the

objects of the Society, excepting only his own maintenance.

24—It shall be competent to the Committee to make grants in the usual manner to any Mission in connection with the Society, which supports its own Clergyman; and any such Mission shall be held to be in connection with the Society whose Clergyman subscribes ten shillings, and makes a collection in his Mission, annually, towards the general funds of the Society.

25—If a Clergyman leave his Mission before the time for sending in his annual collection, the Committee shall have power, on the recommend-dation of the President, to grant him a sum which shall appear equitable.

#### DUTIES OF OFFICERS.

26—In the absence of the President, the Archdeacon, or in his absence the senior Vice President, shall take the chair at all meetings of the Committee or members, and shall have a casting vote.

27—The Treasurer shall receive all monies forwarded to him for the objects of the Society, and shall pay or disburse the same as determined by the Committee, and shall furnish to the President and Committee a statement of accounts up to the day appointed for auditing the same.

28—No money shall be paid or disbursed by the Treasurer except on a written order, specifying the amount to be paid, and its object, which order must be signed by the Chairman of the Committee at which the grant was made, or in his absence, by the senior Officer of the Society in St. John's.

- 29—The Committee shall meet for the despatch of business in St. John's, on the first Thursday after every quarter day, at 2 o'clock, P.M.
- 30—A special meeting of the Committee may be convened at any time, either (1) by the President, or (2) by two Vice-Presidents, or (3) by any five members of the Committee; provided due notice of such meeting, with its objects, be given the day before to all the other members of the Committee in St. John's.
- 31—At a special meeting to be holden seven days before the annual meeting, the Committee shall appoint two of their number to examine the Treasurer's accounts up to that season, which accounts examined, approved and signed by the Auditors as correct, shall be submitted to the Committee, to be by them incorporated in, or appended to the next yearly Report, and so presented to the members at the next annual general meeting.
- 32—The Committee shall fix the salary of the Secretary, and shall provide for all the contingent expenses of the Committee and the Society.

#### DUTIES OF THE SECRETARY.

33—The Secretary shall summon and attend all meetings of the Committee and Members, and shall arrange the business, and record minutes of the same to be signed by the Chairman. He shall prepare the annual report, and superintend the printing of the same; shall conduct the corres-

pondence with the Clergy and others on behalf of the Committee; and shall be responsible for the safe custody of all books, receipts and papers belonging to the Society.

#### PRAYERS.

34—All meetings of the Society, or of the Committee, shall be opened and closed with the prayers used at the meetings of the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel, or others provided for the purpose by the Bishop of the Diocese.

#### ALTERATION OF RULES.

35—These rules may be altered, repealed or added to by the members assembled at any general meeting: provided the proposed alteration has been stated in writing by any person intending to propose it, to the Secretary, at least a month before, for the information of the President and Committee, and that assent has been given to it by the President and a majority of the whole Committee convened for its consideration: and provided also, that it shall be competent to the President to propose any alteration to a general meeting, notwithstanding such alteration may not have received the assent of the Committee.

#### NEW DEANERIES.

36—New Deaneries created by the Lord Bishop of the Diocese shall be allowed to elect Representatives: provided that in every Deanery there shall be at least two resident Clergymen, and ten Churches and congregations.

#### SECURITIES.

37—At each annual meeting there shall be appointed three members of this Society, who shall

be requested to examine all securities belonging to the general funds of the Society, or belonging or appertaining to the Clergy Widows and Orphans' Fund, or to any other fund over which the Society has or shall have control, and to report in writing to the President, or, in his absence, to the senior Vice-President, in St. John's, their opinion upon the sufficiency or insufficiency of the same; and if necessary a special meeting of the Committee shall be convened to consider such report, and to take such action upon it as shall be deemed requisite.

38—All title deeds, mortgages and other securities belonging to the Society, or over which it has control, shall be deposited and preserved in a suitable muniment box to be provided by the President for the time being, at the expense of the Society, and to be always kept in his charge for the use of the Society.

Note.—While it is expected that every Clergyman in the Colony will make a yearly collection for the promotion of the objects of the Church Society, and impress upon every individual under his Pastoral charge the obligations by which he is bound to contribute thereto, year by year,—the system of the Church Society does not require any Clergyman to withhold the ordinances of the Church in any case of refusal or neglect to pay towards his support.

#### BYE-LAWS

OF THE

# Hewfoundland Church Society RESPECTING GRANTS.

#### NEW BUILDINGS.

- 1—No grant shall be made towards the erection of any Church, School, or Parsonage, or towards the purchase of any Land in any Mission or Settlement, until the Land has been secured in trust for ever for the Members of the Church of England resident in the said settlement.
- 2—No grant shall be made towards the erection of any Church, School, or Parsonage, until a plan with an estimate of the cost, and the means of meeting the cost, have been submitted to the Committee.
- 3—No grant to any Church shall exceed one-third, and no grant to any School or Parsonage shall exceed one-fourth of the estimated and probable cost; except under special circumstances, approved by the Committee.
- 4—The first moiety of any grant towards the erection of any Church, School or Parsonage, shall not be payable until the building is at least boarded all round and covered in; and the second moiety shall not be payable until the building

is finished and ready for occupation and use.

N.B.—All the above rules shall apply in respect of the enlargement of any Church, School, or Parsonage House.

REPAIRS.

5—No grant shall be made towards the repair of any Church, School, or Parsenage House, until an estimate of the cost, and the means of meeting the cost have been submitted to the Committee.

6—No grant shall be made until after an interval of seven years from the last grant for a like purpose; and no grant towards the repair, including painting of any Church, shall exceed one-half, or of any School or Parsonage, one-third of the probable and estimated cost, except under special circumstances, approved by the Committee.

7—No grant towards the repair of any Church, School, or Parsonage House shall be payable until the work is fully completed, and the cost ascertained, and the whole amount, with the Society's

grant, provided for.

8—All votes passed by the Committee shall lapse to the general purposes of the Church Society, if not expended and applied for within three years from the time the vote was made.

CLERGY, WIDOWS AND ORPHANS FUND.

Clergymen unable to make their yearly collection in their mission for the Clergy Widows and Orphans' Fund, as required by the seventh standing rule, through absence with the Bishop's leave, shall be required in every case to pay in lieu thereof a sum not less than one pound  $(\pounds 1)$  currency, or more at the discretion of the Committee.

#### **PROCEEDINGS**

At the thirty-second Anniversary of the New-FOUNDLAND CHURCH Society, holden at St. John's, in the Cathedral Sunday-School Building, on Monday, June 30, 1873.

The Chair was taken at 8 o'clock, P.M., by the Right Rev. the Lord Bishop, assisted by the Right Rev. the Lord Bishop Coadjutor.

After prayer, the business of the evening commenced with reading the Report, and submitting the Treasurer's accounts, after which the following Resolutions were proposed, seconded, and carried unanimously:—

Moved by Rev. G. S. CHAMBERLAIN, seconded by Rev. W. KIRBY:—

1—That the Report now read be adopted, and printed with the Treasurer's accounts.

Moved by Rev. Edward Colley, seconded by Mr. Camp:—

2—That devout thanks be humbly offered to Almighty God for the many tokens of His favour vouchsafed during the past year.

Moved by Rev. J. M. Noel, seconded by P. Emerson, Esq. :—

3—That this meeting hails with the greatest satisfaction the establishment of a Synod for the Diocese of Newfoundland, assured that the deliberations of the Synod will ever be directed to promote the well-being and advancement of the Church in this Colony.

Moved by Hon. Judge Fobinson, seconded by Rev. W. Smith, and supported by Rev. F. R. Murray:—

4—That the thanks of this meeting, on behalf of the members of the Church in this Diocese, be heartily given to the

Right Reverend the Lord Bishop Coadjutor, for his strenuous and successful exertions to procure aid in England towards the completion of the fund necessary for the endowment of the Bishopric, and to those friends in England who have shewn their sympathy by their liberal contributions.

Moved by Rev. R. T. Dobie, seconded by Rev. John Lockward:—

5—That the thanks of this meeting are due, and are hereby respectfully offered, to the Right Rev. the Lord Bishop of the Diocese, as President of this Society: also to the Officers and Committee for their services duving the past year;—that W. H. Mane, Esq. be appointed Treasurer, and the Rov. George M. Johnson, Secretary, for the ensuing year; and that E. L. Janus, P. Hutchins, and G. T. Rendell, Esqrs., be appointed to discharge the duties required by the 37th standing rule.

Moved by W. V. Whiteway, Esq., Q. C., seconded by Rev. R. M. Johnson, and supported by Rev. George Hutchinson:—

6-That the thanks of this meeting be cordially given to the Right Rev. the Lord Bishop for his kindness in presiding on this occasion.

The following resolution, proposed by the Coadjutor Bishop, was also put towards the close of the evening, and carried by acclamation:—

7—That this meeting records its hearty welcome to the Rev. F. R. MURRAY, JOSEPH CURLING, Esq., and the rest of the gentlemen who have accompanied them to Newfoundland, for the work of the Church in this Diocese.

The meeting was dismissed by the Bishop with his Benediction after the Doxology had been sung.

### REPORT-1372.

THE Committee of the Newfoundland Church Society approach the duty of preparing their Report for the thirty-second Annual Meeting, with the expression of gratification at the presence of so many of the Clergy, summoned to attend the tenth general Visitation of the Lord Bishop in St. John's; and to inaugurate the Synod of the Church in this Your Committee trust that much of the benefit that, under God, may be expected, will result from both these occasions, specially that the deliberations of Bishop, Clergy, and Laity in Synod assembled, may contribute towards the completion of the work so well begun already, and that the issue may be the establishment of the Church in this Colony, under the constitutions of the Synod, on a basis that may endure, secure and safe, in all succeeding generations. That so very large a proportion of the Clergy has attended the meeting of the Synod augurs well for the realization of these hopes; and your Committee feel assured that the laity, as represented by their delegates, will not have been found wanting in the exercise of that watchful consideration necessary for passing such rules as may secure the object for which the Synod has been formed. Your Committee respectfully offer their hearty congratulations to the Bishop upon the fact that every thing has so far proceeded satisfactorily, and on the circumstance that his Lordship's diocese, by the establishment of a Synod therein, has at length completed the number of such Church institutions in the Provinces of British North America, and that the final organization

of our Synod has the prospect, under God's good Providence, of being so well accomplished.

Only ten months having elapsed since the last Annual Meeting, it may be, perhaps, expected that there is less than the usual amount of information to communicate. With respect to finances, it may, nevertheless, be said that a full year's business has to be reported on, inasmuch as between the months of June and October little is usually received to add to, or voted to diminish the balance accounted for at the previous anniversary. Your Committee adopt their usual plan of placing one against the other, in tabular form, under different heads, the contributions of the past two years. These have been as follows:—

Your Committee have to observe upon the above statements, that whereas the sums received from the three congregations in St John's have been increased, almost entirely, by the enlarged contributions of the Cathedral and St. Thomas', from £669 1s. 5d. to £751 12s. 2d., the out-harbor amount has fallen back from £284 0s. 4d. to £249 9s. 1d. This circumstance arises not from lessened amounts where collections have been made, but from the absence, temporary or otherwise, of the Clergy of the Missions of Portugal Cove, Channel, Tilt Cove, Bay of Islands, and Ferryland,—from none of which localities has any money been received. Next year, it is hoped, will find all these lists in their places in the Church Society's Report for at least their usual amounts. During the past year New Harbor and White Bay have returned to co-operation with the Church Society, small remittances having been made from each.

From the facts above recorded, it arises that the balance in the Treasurer's hands has been altered from £496 4s. 10d. to £639 2s. 8d. in the way of increase. The usual Scalers' collection has been made this year by the Secretary; but, owing to the unsettled condition of the accounts in some of the Merchants' offices, in connection with the Scal fishery, the money has not yet been received. It is believed the amount will be larger than last year, but whatever it may be it must unavoidably remain to be reported on hereafter. Only that the later period of last year's meeting gave more time, the same difficulty would then likewise have occurred. Should the names of those who have

given be received in time, they will be printed in the appendix.

#### CLERGY WIDOWS' AND ORPHANS' FUND.

Your Committee have to announce, with regret, that by the death, in London, towards the end of March, of the Rev. W. J. MILNER, late Missionary at Greenspond, the name of another widow has been added to the Pension-list, increasing the yearly amount, for which the fund is liable, to exactly £300 currency. In the course of the past year the floating balance to the credit of this fund has been invested in the purchase of additional water stock to the value of £200, and of Government debenture notes representing the value of £134 currency. There remains in the Commercial Bank to the credit of this fund, after the above investments, a sum barely sufficient to pay the pensions due for the half year which to-day expires. More than £30 currency has been expended in paying off the claims of three Clergymen who have left the Diocese. Your Committee draw attention to the fact that the capital of this fund, which was last year £3,828 12s.  $6J_{\cdot}$ , has only increased to the amount of £4,031 0s. 1d., and would particularly press this fact on the notice of all the members of the Church, and specially upon the Clergy who are assembled in such large numbers, with reference to whom the opportunity is taken to urge the very great importance of using their utmost endeavours to increase the annual collections, which are in many cases miserably small, so as to secure the permanence of this fund in which they are themselves so deeply interested.

#### BOOK DEPOSITORY.

Little need be said upon this very useful institution, the value of which has come, under the good management of its present keeper, to be fully recognised both by laity and clergy. The sales, during the year to which this Report refers, have been altogether £457 Ss. This is a smaller amount than for the previous year, when, no doubt, the presence of so many of the Clergy contributed to increase the demand for books. The best endeavours are used to maintain the Depository in the fullest state of efficiency, and to make the supply of all kinds of books as far as possible equal to the demands that arise from time to time.

#### BISHOPRIC ENDOWMENT FUND.

No public statement of the progress of this fund has been made since November last, when the first annual Report of the Committee was printed. The following is the summary of contributions received to the date of October, 1872, as then published:

An analysis of the sources whence arises the sum of £1,766 6s. 0d., placed to the credit of Newfoundland, shews that it has been contributed by the congregations of the three Churches in St. John's, and by 21 of the out-harbor missions. It also further appears that £1,354 17s. has been given from the Cathedral by the Bishop of the Diocese,

the Coadjutor Bishop, and by two Clergymen and 15 of the laity, and as the result of a congregational collection; £1,140 of this sum being the contribution of the Bishops and three other gentlemen. To the St. Thomas' collection the two Clergy and eleven others have given £121, to which may be added £11 6s. 2d., collected in the Church; while from St. Mary's by its Clergyman, and by a collection, and from 19 of that congregation, has been sent the amount of £35 17s. 10d. as their first year's offering. Nor from the out-harbors are the returns, as far as printed, more satisfactory than this meagre contribution from the wealth and numbers of the congregations in St. John's. From 21 only of 39 out-harbor Missions, in charge of as many Clergymen, had any remittances been received to the time above-mentioned. St. John's out-harbors, Fogo, Herring Neck, and Harbor Buffett alone have subscriptions from any number of persons been forwarded, and from ten Missions the name only of the Clergyman, or the amount of a collection, or a single individual offering, is all that shews a knowledge of the need, or of the appeal for contributions to this great object. How stenderly the call has been responded to is shewn from the circumstance, that in addition to the Bishop and the Coadjutor Bishop, and 17 of the Clergy, 142 persons only, from all the congregations of the diocese, have given what has yet been received. If so few could do so much, who shall say that to an appeal more generally and diligently urged a due response would not have ere now been made? It is somewhat more satisfactory to state that to the present time the sum of £2,562 10s. 10d., which appears above, has been increased to £3,130 by additional payments and Bank interest.

The Coadjutor Bishop, on his return from his voyage of Visitation of the Northern portions of the Labrador coast, and of the Missions of White Bay, Twillingate, and Fogo, and of the two Missions of Placentia Bay, in the Church Ship Lavrock, went to England, at the request of the Bishop and of the Committee of the Bishopric Endowment Fund, to endeavour to raise a sum of £2,000 sterling, in order to complete the sum of £10,000. In this purpose your Committee has the pleasure of announcing that he has been suc-The Bishop reports that he has everywhere been most kindly received, and the promises and actual payments to this fund, resulting from his appeal, now amount to about £2,200 sterling, with a prospect of some further additions. Coadjutor Bishop was accompanied on his return to Newfoundland by the Rev. Frederick Murray, and Messrs. Curling, Norfolk, and Moor, who have all come with the purpose of devoting themselves to the work of the Church in this Colony; and another lay gentleman, with the same object in view, has since arrived. Your Committee are assured that the Meeting will join with them in the expression of thankfulness to the Coadjutor Bishop for these results from his protracted stay in England, and in acknowledgment of the great labour gone through in accomplishing the object of his visit.


It is the purpose of the Bishop, as soon as released from the duty of presiding at the Synod, to take his departure on a Visitation voyage in the Lavrock, proceeding first to Bay of Islands and Bonne Bay, and thence to the various Missions on the Eastern coast. It is understood that he will be accompanied by the Rev. G. M. Johnson and Rev. E. Botwood, by Mr. Curling who takes charge of the navigation of the Church Ship, and by one of the students of the Theological College. Your Committee heartily wish that the voyage may be safe and prosperous.

Three Deacons have been advanced to the Priesthood since the last annual meeting—viz., the Clergymen of Battle Harbor, Belloram and St. George's Bay. Mr. Cornelius Ellingham, of the Theological College, who has since been employed at Portugal Cove, was ordained Deacon at Christ-The number of the Clergy has also been increased by the addition to their ranks of the Rev. John Godden, late of the diocese of Montreal. Mr. Godden, who is a native of this colony, has been appointed to the charge of a new Mission, comprising the South side of Harbor Grace and Bryant's Cove. He has entered very energetically on his work, and his presence at his station is already beneficially felt by the people among whom he is placed, and will no doubt be a relief to the Clergy of the over populous Missions on either side of the new district. Besides this alteration in the previously existing Missions of the diocese, the out-harbours of St John's have been also divided at the suggestion of the Rev. R. M. Johnson, supported by the petition of the people of Petty Harbor for a resident Clergyman,

and their promise to maintain him, with the help of a small proportion of the grant of the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel in Foreign Parts. To this new Mission, comprising Petty Harbor and Bay of Balls, the Rev. R. Dobue has been appointed, and the Rev. R. M. Johnson has taken charge of Pouch Cove and Torbay, with residence at the former place, on a similar understanding.

A Parsonage has been already built at Petty Harbor, and another is in progress of erection at Pouch Cove, towards each of which the Committee has had much pleasure in making grants.

Last year at the annual meeting your Committee had to regret the absence of the Bishop in Bermuda, and of the Coadjutor Bishop on a Visitation voyage, in Placentia Bay. On the present occasion they have the advantage of the presence of the two Bishops and of a large number of the Clergy, and of the delegates of the Synod of the The Governor, they are sorry to say, is Diocese. unavoidably absent. With this exception they have every reason to congratulate themselves on the interesting character of the meeting, and every cause to give devout thanks to Almighty God for the many tokens of his favour, of which they have been enabled to speak, in which pleasing Christian duty, as the fittest conclusion of their Report, they invite all present humbly and heartily to unite.

Clergymen unable to make their annual collections for the CLERGY WIDOWS' AND ORPHANS' FUND through absence with the Bishop's leave, shall pay in lieu thereof a sum of not less than £1 currency, or more, at the discretion of the Committee.

It is particularly requested that all subscription lists and remittances to the Church Society may be made up and sent in, as far as practicable, not later than some time in the month of March in each year.

#### STANDING RULES

OF THE

## Glergy Widows' and Orphans' fund.

1—The Newfoundland Church Society's Special Fund, for assisting the Widows and Orphans of deceased Clergymen of the Diocese of Newfoundland, shall consist of all monies paid to the Treasurer of the Society for that object.

2—The Committee of the Church Society shall have the management of the Fund.

3—Every Hundred Pounds of available surplus shall be invested by the Committee as opportunities occur. Smaller sums shall be deposited every quarter in the Savings' Bank.

4—All Clergymen in the Diocese holding the Bishop's license may secure the benefit of this Fund by contributing within six months from the time of obtaining their License from the Bishop, as follows:—(1) Unmarried Clergymen and Widowers without a child, one pound (£1) per annum; (2) Married Clergymen (and such as shall afterwards become married,) and Widowers with a child, two pounds (£2) per annum.

5—Annual subscriptions shall be payable in advance on the 1st day of January in each year: provided that Clergymen on entry shall for that year pay only a rateable proportion of the annual subscription up to the 1st day of January following. Thirty days grace shall be allowed, but

every Clergyman neglecting to make payment within that time, shall forfeit his claim upon the Fund, to be recovered only upon payment of arrears, with ten per cent thereon, before the following 1st day of January.

6—Any Clergyman neglecting to subscribe according to Rule 4, or to pay his annual subscription within the time limited by Rule 5, may, if the Committee see fit to admit or re-admit him, secure the benefit of the Fund by the payment of two pounds ten shillings (£2 10s.), if married or a widower with a child; and one pound ten shillings (£1 10s.) if unmarried or a widower without a child, from the day on which the last annual subscription to be paid was due, or from the date of his being licensed by the Bishop, and from the date of such admission or re-admission, he shall come under the operation of Rule 4.

7—Every Clergyman securing the benefit of this Fund will be required to make a yearly collection for the same in his Mission, and to forward the amount, with his own annual subscription, to the Treasurer.

8—The Widow of every Clergyman who shall have paid his annual subscription, and forwarded an annual collection, till his death, or till incapacitated by mental or bodily infirmity, shall be entitled to receive a yearly pension of thirty pounds (£30) currency, during widowhood.

9—If the Fund should at any time permit, the Committee may increase the amount of pension to any sum not exceeding £50; such an addition, however, being subject to be withdrawn wholly or

in part, should the state of the Fund not warrant its continuance.

1.

10—If the Widow die or marry again, the pension shall be paid to Trustees for the benefit of such children of the deceased husband as may be, if boys, under sixteen, if girls, under eighteen, years of age.

11—The Trustees named by a deceased Clergyman, in the event of the death or marriage of his Widow, shall be recognized by the Committee in paying the pension for the benefit of the child or children; but if the Trustees so named are unwilling or unable to act, the Bishop of the Diocese shall act as Trustee in the application of the pension.

12—If the wife die before her husband, his child or children shall receive the pension, so long as there is a claimant under Rule 10.

13—The pensions shall be paid half-yearly by the Bishop's order on the Treasurer, on the first of January and first of July. The first payment to be calculated for the interval from the husband's death to the day of payment.

14—If a Clergyman having joined the Fund after the 24th June, 1863, removes from the Diocese after having served less than fourteen years, his connection with the Fund shall cease, and he shall be entitled to receive back half the amount of the annual subscriptions he has paid. If he removes after having served fourteen years and less than twenty-one years, he shall be allowed to remain in connection with the Fund by paying an annual subscription of six pounds, or nine pounds

if residing within the tropics; or he may receive back half his annual subscriptions, upon which his connection with the Fund shall cease. If he removes after having served twenty-one years, he shall be allowed to remain in connection with the Fund by paying an annual subscription of five pounds, or seven pounds ten shillings if residing within the tropics; or he may receive back three-fourths of his annual subscriptions, upon which his connection with the Fund shall cease. All Clergymen in connection with the Fund previous to the 24th June, 1863, to be governed by the original Rule 14 thereof.

15—A yearly statement of the Treasurer's accounts with this Fund shall be published, with the Society's Report.

16—None of the above Rules shall be altered or repealed, except at a General Meeting of the Church Society, and after a full year's notice to the members of the proposed change.

The following is the original Rule 14, governing Clergymen in connection with the Fund be-

fore June 24, 1863:—

"14—If a Clergyman removes, with the Bishop's consent, from the Diecese, after officiating in it not less than seven years, he shall be allowed his claim upon the Fund, on the payment of an annual subscription of three pounds (£3); or, if he desire it, may receive back half the amount he has paid, which re-payment shall release the Fund from all his claims upon it."
