





GENERAL BY-LAWS.

ARTICLE I

THE objects of the Society shall be comprehended in the following distinct departments of Christian exertion, viz:

Tinct departments of Christian exercice, viz: First-Missionary labour, including the creation of a fund towards the augmentation of the stipends of poor Clergymen, and towards making a provision for those who may be incapacitated by age or infirmity, and for the widows and orphans of the Clergy. Second-Education, and Day and Sunday Schools.

Third-Assistance where it may be necessary, to those who may be under preparation for the ministry of the Gospel.

Fourth--- Circulation of the Holy Scriptures, the Book of Common Prayer, and such other Books and Tracts as shall be approved of by the Central Board hereinafter to be provided for.

Fifth-Aid towards the erection of Churches, and Parsonage Houses, and the management of all matters relating to the endowment and maintenance of the same.

ARTICLE II.

His Excellency the Governor General, if a member of the Church of England, shall be requested to become the Patron of the Society.

ARTICLE III.

The President of the Society shall be the Lord Bishop of Quebec, or Bishop administering the Diocese; and the Vice-Presidents shall con-sist of such Chairmen of the different District Associations, hereinafter provided for, as are members of the Corporation, and such other persons as shall be nominated at the General Annual Meeting of the Society, from among the members of the Corporation.

The President shall have the custody of the scal of the Society.

ARTICLE IV.

The Treasurer or Joint Treasurers, the Secretary or Secretaries, the Auditors and other necessary Officers of the Society, shall be appointed by the Central Board. The Secretary or Secretaries shall be allowed a salary or salaries and travelling expenses, under the direction of the Cen-tral Board, and may appoint an Assistant Secretary or Secretaries, subject to the approval of the Central Board, provided that such appointment shall entail no additional burthen upon the Society. The appointments of Treasurer and Secretary shall not be for any specified period, but they may be removed at the pleasure of the Central Board.

ARTICLE V.

The Treasurer or Joint Treasurers shall receive all subscriptions, donations, rents, issues, and profits, payable to the Society, for which purpose a paid Collector or Collectors may be employed. Such monies shall be deposited in such Bank or Banks as shall from time to time be indicated or approved of by the Central Board.

No money shall be paid by the Treasurer without the authority of a resolution of the Central Board, certified by the Secretary, expressing the name of the person to whom, and the purpose for which the money is to be paid.

be paid. The Treasurer or Treasurers shall also have the custody of all deeds, bonds, securities and other documents relating to the property of the Society, (which, after registration, shall be deposited in one of the approved Banks.) and shall submit his or their accounts at the stated periodical Meetings of the Central Board.

ARTICLE VI.

The Secretary shall keep the Minutes of all the proceedings of the Society, as well as of the Central Board; and shall have the eustody of and be accountable for the safe keeping of the same, and he shall be subject to the direction and control of the Central Board in all his duties and proceedings.

ARTICLE VIL

The Society shall meet annually, on the first Wednesday in July, at Quebec, whereof not less than fifteen days notice shall be given by the Seorctary, in at least one of the leading Newspapers in Quebec, and elsewhere as may seem to him expedient. A Special Meeting of the Society may be called at any time by the President, or in his absence from the Diocese, or in the event of a vacancy in the See, by two of the Vice-Presidents and ten other members of the Society, by a written order to the Secretary, who shall notify the same in the manner hereinbefore provided in respect of the Annual Meetings.

ARTICLE VIII.

Persons subscribing 25s. per annum, or giving a contribution once for all of $\pounds 12$ 10s. shall be capable of being elected Members of the Corporation, (in the latter case for life,) at any meeting of the Society.

Contributors may limit and direct any portion, not exceeding one half, of their contributions, to be applied to special objects within the designs and purposes of the Society.

Lists of the persons so subscribing or contributing, shall be furnished by the Treasurers of the District Associations, or by the Treasurer or Treasurers of the Society, where there shall be no District Association, to the Secretary of the Society, to be laid before the next meeting of the Society at which an election may take place.

ciety at which an election may take place. No Annual Subscribers, not being Life Members, shall be eligible to any office at the Meetings of the Society, or capable of voting, or using any other privilege as members of the Corporation, until all arrears of subscription, accrued subsequently to July 1st, 1850, shall have been paid in full.

ARTICLE IX.

Of the Central Board.

There shall be a Central Board for the management of the general business of the Society, consisting of the President, the Vice-Presidents, and the other Officers of the Society, the Incumbent and Church Wardens of every Church or Chapel of the United Church of England and Ireland within the Diocese, being members of the Corporation, and of such others as shall be chosen annually at the General Meeting of the Society, from among the members of the Corporation.

The Board shall meet four times a-year, at Quebee, on the Wednesdays nearest to the 10th January, the 15th May, and the 10th Octoher, and on the Thursday next after the Annual Meeting. Special Meetings may be called by the President, or, in his absence from the Diocese, or in the event of a vacancy in the See, by two of the Vice-Presidents, and four members of the Board: and not less than seven members present at any meeting shall form a quorum. When a sufficient number of members to form a quorum shall not assemble on the regular day of meeting, the members present shall have power to adjourn to another day, and so on totics quoics, until a quorum shall be found; and business shall and may

The Central Board shall have authority to make such rules as may be necessary for the Government of its own affairs, provided that none of them be contrary to, or inconsistent with, the spirit of the Constitution or By-Laws of the Society.*

ARTICLE X.

Of District Associations.

In connexion and correspondence with the Central Board, there shall be formed District Associations, (except in the City of Quebee, and the Banlieues thereof.) to be composed of the Clergy, and all other members of the Society resilent within the bounds of such Districts; a contribution of 5s, per annum constituting membership of such District Associations. The District Associations, (except as hereinbefore excepted.) shall continue as heretofore settled by the Central Board of the Society, before its Incorporation, until otherwise hereafter determined by the Central Board. The senior Clergyman holding a Pastoral Charge within such bounds, and being a member of such Association, shall be *ex officio*, Chairman thereof:—they may have a Secretary and Treasurer, and shall meet at such places as they may themselves determine; at one of which meetings the officers shall be appointed and a report of the proceedings of the year read. The District Associations shall have authority to make rules for the government of their own affines, provided such rules be not contrary to, or inconsistent with, the Constitution or By-Laws of the Society. They shall report annually to the Central Board, at least one month before the Annual General Meeting of the Society, (and at such other times as the Secretary, on behalf of the Board, shall require,) a statement of their proceedings, and a detailed account of the monies received and expended by them during the year.

ARTICLE XL-

Of the Sub-Committees of the Society.

For the more effectually carrying on the designs of this Society the Clergyman and Church Wardens in every Parish and Missionary Station, and the Ministers and Wardens of every Chapelry within the Diocese, shall be a Sub-Committee of the Society, in correspondence with the District Association, within whose bounds such Parish or Missionary Station is situated, or in the City of Quebee, with the Central Board, through the Secretary of the Society. This Committee shall meet as often, and at such periods, as they themselves shall decide to be most convenient, inviting the cooperation of all the Parishioners, in their deliberations and designs. They

• It is one of the rules of the Central Board that no application for a grant of money shall be entertained by the Board, unless such application shall have reached the hands of the Bernetary, a forthight at least before the next ensuing meeting of the Beard. shall collect subscriptions and donations from the members of the Church, in such manner as they shall deem most effective, and endeavour, be every means in their power, to augment the resources of the Society. Ony sermon at least shall be prenched during the year within the limits of each Tarlsh, Station, or Chapelry, on such Sunday as the Bichop shall appoint, in favor of some one or more of the objects of the Society; and a collection shall be then made in aid thereof, the proceeds of which shall forthwith be remitted to the Treasurer or Treasurers of the Society; any Parish, Station, or Chupelry, in which such sermon shall not have been preached, shall not be considered entitled to any grant or benefit from the Society, until a sermon shall have been so preached.

All other monies raised by such Sub-Committees, shall be remitted to the Treasurer of the District Association; or to the Treasurer or Treasurers of the Society where such monies shall have been raised within the City and Balliques of Euclidee.

ARTICLE XII.

One-half of all the monics paid into the hands of the Treasurers of the District Associations, respectively, and not specially appropriated by the contributors, shall be transmitted to the Treasurer of the Society, to be at the disposal of the Central Board, and the remaining half of all such collections shall, when required, be expended within the Parish or District in which they have been made, for such objects only as are specified in the Constitution of this Society.—the allotment to be made by the Committee of the District Association. All monies, remaining unappropriated at the General Annual Meeting of the District Association, shall be forthwith transmitted to the Treasurer or Treasurers of the Society to be at the disposal of the Central Board.

ARTICLE XIII.

Of the Lay Committee of the Church Society.

A Lay Committee, consisting of not less than thirteen members shall be chosen, at the first meeting of the Central Board after the Annual Meeting of the Society, from among the members of the Corporation. Three members shall form a quorum, and they shall have power to fill up any vacancies which may arise within their own body, and shall be governed by the Constitution, Rules, and Regulations adopted and in force before the Incorporation of the Society, until the same shall be altered by the Committee, or by the Society at the General Meeting.

The proceedings of the Lay Committee shall be subject to the sanction of the Bishop of the Diocese. The clerical and other members of the Central Board may attend at any of the General Meetings of the Committee, and may propose and discuss matters therein, but shall have no vote; and the Committee shall report their proceedings to the Central Board at their stated meetings. The objects of this Committee shall be: *First*—The placing the Clergymen, now resident and doing duty in the

Hirst—The placing the Clergymen, now resident and doing duty in the Province, upon a just footing as regards the sufficiency and permanency of their incomes.

Secondly—The providing for the permanent and adequate support of an increased number of Clergymen, so that, with the least possible delay, the members of the Church, in every portion of the Diocese, may have the means of access to a Church within a practicable distance.

means of access to a Church within a practicable distance. *Thirdly*—The building, in every place where it may be required, a Church of stone or brick, upon a well considered plan, as to dimensions, external form, and internal arrangement, keeping in view the probability of its requiring enlargement. Fourthly—The building, in a good situation, convenient to the Church, a comfortable Parsonage of brick or stone, the plan of which should be carefully considered, with reference to size and internal arrangement, and should admit of additions being made, with the sanction of the Bishop.

Sixthiy—The insuring such Churches or Parsonages against losses by fire. Sixthiy—The procuring an adequate and permanent support for all the Institutions, authorities, and functionaries, suitable and appertaining to the Establishment of the Church of England in this Diocese.

Seventhly—The investing all life subscriptions, (unless so far as the application of these may be otherwise limited by the contributors,) in a permanent and accumulating Fund, of which the interest only shall be applied to the general purposes of the Society.

Eighthly—The encouraging the formation of a Local Endowment Fund, at every station or place having a Church or Clergyman, by special contributions, or by setting apart a portion of the Pew-rents, to form an accumulating fund, until the net income shall in each case amount to £50 per annum; for the more effectual promotion of which object the Society will engage, whenever such fund shall be formed and shall amount to £100, invested in Bank-stock, or other public securities, to add thereto an amount not exceeding £100; provided always that such investment shall stand in the name of the President of the Society.

Ninthly-The management and the superintendence of all lands belonging to the Society.

ARTICLE XIV.

All meetings of the Society and of the Committees shall be opened and closed with the Prayers used by the two Societies in England, adapted to our situation under the direction of the Bishop.

No alteration or amendment in the Constitution or By-laws of the Society shall be made unless such alteration or amendment shall be proposed at one and adopted at another General Meeting of the Society, provided that foot lass than one month intervene between the two Meetings and that the object of the Meetings be stated in the advertisement by which they are called. At all Meetings of the Society, of the Central Board, or of Committees, the Chairman, in case of an equality of votes, shall have a double or casting vote.

ARTICLE XV.

Whereas some members of the Church, who are not unmindful of the great Spiritual wants of their own neighbourhood, still feel constrained, in pious gratitude for the blessings they enjoy, to allot something, however small, from the means with which a Gracious Providence has blessed them, towards the spread of the Glorious Gospel among the nations which still sit in darkness; the Society will gladly receive and forward to the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel, the Church Missionary Society, or the London Society for Promoting Christianity among the Jews, whatever sums may be given for the conversion and instruction of the Heathen or the Jews.

Prevent us, O Lord, in all our doings with Thy most gracious favour, and further us with Thy continual help; that in all our works, begun, continued, and ended in Thee, we may glorify Thy Holy Name, and finally, by Thy mercy, obtain everlasting life; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

O merciful God, who hast made all men, and hatest nothing that Thou hast made, nor wouldest the death of a sinner, but rather that he should be converted and live ; Have mercy upon all Jews, Turks, infidels, and Hereticks, and take from them all ignorance, hardness of heart, and contempt of Thy Word; and so fetch them home, blessed Lord, to Thy flock, that they may be saved among the remnant of the true Israelites, and be one fold under one Shepherd. Prosper, O Lord, the labors of those Societies of the Church in the land of our Fathers, which Thou hast deigned to use in the promotion of this object, and which have nourished the Church in the Colonies; and bless in like manner with Thy Holy Spirit and Providential succour the Society in whose cause we are now met, and the undertakings which we have now in hand. " Prosper Thou the work of our hands upon us; O prosper Thou our handy work," for the sake, and through the merits of the same Thy Son Jesus Christ our Lord, who liveth and reigneth with Thee and the Holy Ghost, one God, world without end. Amen.

The TENTH ANNIVERSARY of this Society was celebrated by a General Meeting, held on 7th July, 1852, in the National School House, Quebec, at seven o'clock P. M.

The LORD BISHOP OF QUEBEO in the Chair.

After the usual prayers and some introductory remarks from the Chair, a copy of the Royal Proclamation, announcing the New Charter granted to the Society, was laid upon the table by the Lord Bishop. His Lordship then called upon the Secretary to read the Annual Report.

The Report having been read, it was moved by Hon. W. WALKER, seconded by REVD. R. G. PLEES, and Resolved,

1. That the Report now read be adopted, and printed under the direction of the Central Board.

Moved by REVD. I. HELLMUTH, seconded by W. ANDREW, Esq., and Resolved,

2. That this Meeting thankfully acknowledges the goodness of Almighty God in the measure of success which has attended the labours of the So-

ciety during the past year. Moved by H. S. Scorr Esq., seconded by Revo. Thomas PENNEFATHER, and Resolved,

3. That there is need of increased exertion on the part of the Churchmen of this Diocese, to enable the Society to enlarge the sphere of its Missionary labours, as well as to make more ample provision for the religious education of the young. Moved by the REVD. E. CULLEN PARKIN, seconded by JAMES MACLA-REN, Esq., and Resolved,

4. That this Meeting rejoices in the success which has attended the late Jubilee Celebration of the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel in Foreign Parts.

Moved by the REVD. JOHN CABBY, seconded by JAMES SEALY, Esq., and Resolved

5. That this Society desires to express its undiminished interest in, and sympathy with the Sister Societies of British North America.

Moved by the REVD. SAML. S. WOOD, seconded by REVD. WM. VALENTINE LLOYD, and Resolved,

6. That the following Gentlemen be requested to accept office as Vice-Presidents during the ensuing year; (see list of Officers, p. 8); and that the Central Board consists of the following gentlemen; (see do.) Moved by J. BELL FORSYTH, Esq., and seconded by the REVD. A. W.

MOUNTAIN,

7. That the thanks of this Meeting are due to the Officers of this Society for their services during the past year, and particularly to the Hon. H. BLACK, for the valuable and gratuitous services rendered by him, when-

ever called on by this Society. Moved by the REVD. W. WICKES, seconded by the REVD. W. KING, and Resolved

8. That the thanks of this Meeting are due, and are hereby tendered to the Hon. W. BADGLEY for his kindness in taking charge of the New Act of Incorporation, during its progress through the Legislature.

The following gentlemen were elected Members of the Corporation : the Revids G. Milne, J. Carry, E. C. Parkin, and W. V. Lloyd, and W. Spragge, and T. D. Harrington, Esquires.

The Report of the Committee appointed to revise the By-laws was read, and it was Resolved, that the Committee be permitted to continue its labors till the next meeting of the Society.

The two first of the amendments in the By-laws, proposed by Mr. Scott at the last General Meeting, were adopted.

The Meeting closed with the Doxology and the Benediction.

ANNUAL REPORT.

THE good providence of our God has brought us to the conclusion of another year. We meet to celebrate the tenth Anniversary of our Society. We meet to return thanks to the Giver of all good, for the blessing He has vouchsafed to our labors. At the same time we meet to ask ourselves how we have fulfilled the high and responsible task, that has devolved upon us, of spreading, by the instrumentality of this Society, the saving knowledge of the Gospel of Christ, and of establishing, on a foundation firmer and yet more firm, the Church of Christ among us.

These questions, general in their nature, your Board would earnestly press home to the heart and conscience of each member of the Society, nay of every Churchman in the Diocese. But little has yet been done to make the Society what it aims at being, and what it ought to be, the great exponent of the Christian liberality of the Church. The standard indeed has been raised, but how few, in comparison with our numbers, have as yot rallied round it!

And should this be? We see here a Society, noble in its Christian designs, and most comprehensive in its character,—a Society, whose very object is to unite Churchmen of all shades of opinion, which would draw to itself the love and liberality of all, and then dispense with a free and impartial hand according to the spiritual wants of the various parts of the Diocese. All our proceedings are open :—all (who will qualify themselves as members) are permitted to take part in our discussions :—all, who love our Sion, we would gladly see at our Council Board, sure that by their presence and their counsel they would impart fresh life and energy to our proceedings, and convinced that a Society which should gather all together to work in harmony and Christian love would receive a rich outpouring of blessings from on High upon its various labors.

Your Board has been led to these remarks, among our reasons, by observing that, though on the whole the income of the Society has, during the past year, risen somewhat above the amount of last year, yet in this, the headquarters of the Diocese, in the City which furnishes the great majority of the present meeting, there has been a decided falling off.*

[•] It is indeed gratifying to remember that the sum of £500 currency was remitted, in aid of the Jubilee Fund of the Society for the Propogation" of the Gospel, from Quebec alone; but it may be well hoped that the bounty Among the matters of interest which have transpired during the past year, your Board is bound first to draw your attention to the New Charter, which has at length received the Royal Sanction, and has again invested us with the privileges of a Corporate Body; and in the second place, to the complete division of the property of the old Society between its two off-shoots of Quebec and Montreal.

Your Board would next refer to the general Statement of Receipts and Expenditure.

St. Francis District Association.

The returns from the several Missions of this District shew that the Society is not losing ground in this part of the Diocese. Last year your Board reported an increase of upwards of one fourth over the contributions of the previous year, and now again a further increase is observable; the sum total raised in the name of the Society, being £148 9s. 1d.

This amount includes £12 10s., the first instalment of a larger amount of £50, contributed towards the third object of the Society by the Revd. W. V. Lloyd, viz., towards the maintenance of some Theological Student of straitened means, in the College, of which he was himself for some time a member.

A much larger sum is also mentioned as raised within the District for local Church purposes. $\pounds474$ reported last year has been replaced by $\pounds674$ in the present. $\pounds41$ 11s. 3d. was sent in on account Jubilee Fund.

Among the exertions made in particular Missions, it may be mentioned that in Sherbrooke alone more than £800 has been raised for various Church purposes, (£100 of which was collected through the praiseworthy efforts of the ladies of the Parish, towards liquidating the debt on the Church,) that in Lennoxville £150 has been expended on requisite improvements; that the new Churches at Compton and Dudswell are progressing towards completion; that in Kingsey and Durham a considerable sum has been spent on painting and completing the Churches, and that in Hatley repairs required on the Church and Burying Ground, and in Eaton the fence round the Parsonage and other improvements have been completed without any aid from without. The poor Mission of Bury has sent in a list of Annual Subscribers to the Society amounting to £10, and Stanstead, a dependency of Haftley, still continues to contribute £20 annually towards the support of the Missionary.

A Depository for the sale of Bibles, Prayer Books and other religious works has been opened during the past year within this District, under the auspices of the Church Society, the head quarters of which are at Lennoxville, and sales to the amount of £23 8s. 5d., have been effected. Small deposits to an amount not exceeding £10 are allowed to be withdrawn by such of the Clergy as are willing to become answerable for the same. It should be added that handsome donations in Books and Money have been made to this Depository by some few individuals on the spot.

Megantic District Association.

The Secretary, who has been resident in this District during six months of the past year, reports that every exertion has been made to organize meetings on behalfof the Church Society in the Missions of this District, in accordance with the suggestion contained in the last Annual Report. The Association is now regularly formed, with a code of By-laws for its guidance, and it is hoped that though local wants press (and are likely for many years to press) heavily upon a population for the most part poor and scattered, yet they will not be unmindful of the claims of Christian fellowship, nor forgetful of the sympathy and support which has again and again been extended to them in their hour of need, by our Society. Doubtless, however, much has to be done by the painstaking and faithful Missionary, before the people generally perceive it to be their duty and high privilege, to help forward the work of the Society-that great work

which brought the Son of God himself from Heaven-the salvation of lost sinners.

£86 has been raised for the Church Society within this District, £24 17s. 5d., for the Jubilee Fund, and £180 5s. for various local objects. Total, £241 2s. 5d.

Through the undefatigable exertions of the Missionary of E. Frampton, the new stone Church of that place was opened for Divine Service in March last. This edifice is said to be in every respect creditable to all parties concerned in its erection. At Point Levi additional efforts are being made to pay off the debt on the Church. In the large Mission of St. Sylvester, the wellknown energy of the Incumbent has been, during the past year, directed to the forwarding of several important works, the completion of which is delayed only by the want of funds. From Leeds a much larger subscription list has been sent in than in any previous year, and in this Mission a new Church is likely soon to be commenced. In New Ireland and Inverness a great effort is being made to finish off the three Churches, and inclose the Burying Grounds of the Mission, the people having contributed according to their means, and much assistance having been rendered by kind friends in Quebec. From Grosse Isle £7 9s. 2d., has been received.

Three Rivers District Association.

Collected for the Church Society, £20 10s., and for the Jubilee Fund, £10 17s. 3d. The only sum reported as raised for local purposes within this District is £20 4s. 5d., on account of the Nicolet Endowment Fund: this fund continues steadily to increase, it amounts now *in toto* to £500, a notable example of what individual exertion, never losing sight of its object, may in a short time accomplish. It is perhaps not generally known that this fund is mainly due to the efforts of one, who was for many years an efficient and valued officer of this Society.

Portneuf District Association.

£16 17s. 5d. has been collected for the Church Society, within the limits of this Association; £11 15s. for the Jubilee Fund, and £95 12s. for local objects. Total, £124 2s. 5d.

In two out of the three Missions which constitute this Association, it is hoped that before long Parsonage Houses will be erected, and at Portneuf, besides £100 subscribed for this object, the commencement has been made towards an Endowment.

Gaspe' District Association.

This District has not, it is to be regretted, made any effort to organize itself since the suggestion made in the Annual Report of last year. £21 5s. 9d. has, however, been collected for the Society, consisting of proceeds of Sermons and of £12 10s. a life subscription, from the Revd. G. Milne, of New Carlisle; and £10 8s. 11d. was raised on account of the Jubilee Fund.

The Officers of the Society

Remain the same as at this period last year, with the exception of one of the Vice-Presidents, who has left the Diocese, but who had shown himself during a short residence among us, a ready and liberal supporter of our Society.

The Secretary of the Society acted as Chaplain at the Quarantine Station during the summer of last year, and afterwards visited the Saguenay, as Travelling Missionary of the Society. His Journals, in both these capacities, duly appeared in the numbers of the "Canadian Ecclesiastical Gazette." Since the month of December last, he has been actively engaged as a Missionary in the District of Megantic. the appointment being a temporary one, until the Bishop should have a Clergyman at his disposal, to station there. Owing to the dutics connected with an extensive charge, the Sccretary was not able during the past winter to embrace a very wide range in his visits as Travelling Agent. He, however, visited four Missions in the District of St. Francis, besides attending meetings in his own District, and would have visited others, had it been convenient for the Clergy of the same to summon meetings in favor of the Society.

Your Board and its several Commttees have been engaged during the past year in the ordinary work of the Society. Among the most important business transacted by the Board has been first, an arrangement entered into with the lady conducting the Diocesan Female School of Montreal, by which the daughters of the Clergy of this Diocese are admitted to the enjoyment of the advantages of that Institution at half price, provided the number should at no one time exceed five. A junction has also been effected between the Diocesan Committee of the Society for Promoting Christian Knowledge, and this Society, on most favorable terms, the whole of the Books and Tracts belonging to

the Committee having become the property of the Society without any pecuniary advance, and on the simple engagement on the part of the Board, that in order to enable the Committee to sell at reduced prices, and to distribute gratuitously, an annual sum of £25 be placed at its disposal. The new Committee is styled the Depository Committee, in connection with the Society for Promoting Christian Knowledge. It holds its meetings on the first Wednesday in every month, and is then glad to receive applications from the Clergy of the Diocese, having during the past year distributed 46 Bibles and Testaments, Prayer Books 90, and Tracts and Elmentary Books to the amount of upwards of £7, besides a grant to the value of $\pounds 32$ 10s. to aid in the establishment of the Book and Tract Depository for the St. Francis District. The Quebec Depository is under the management of Mrs. Edie, Couillard Street.

Your Board had also observed that the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel, with its usual liberality, had set apart £1000 per annum, to be spent in the encouragement of local Endowments in the Diocese of Montreal. The Venerable Society has agreed to grant a sum not exceeding £150, (and not being at the same time more than onehalf the purchase money,) on condition that the same amount be raised in the Mission, or otherwise,—the whole to be spent in the purchase of land for a Glebe; and your Board immediately addressed, through its President, a respectful inquiry to the Venerable Society, as to whether the same assistance might not be extended to the Missions of this Diocese. No answer has as yet been received to this application.

The Lay Committee of your Board has been much crippled in its efforts during the past year, owing to the legal difficulties in the way of sccuring or disposing of land before the new Charter was obtained. Several matters of pressing importance have thus been necessarily laid by for a season; now, however, they will receive the immediate attention of the Committee.

The Jubilee of the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel, was an event generally celebrated throughout the Diocese, Advent Sunday having been appointed for commemoration thereof by Sermons, and for a general collection by the way of thank-offering. The City of Quebec was also canvassed, and the result of this appeal to our Christian gratitude and liberality, shewed itself in a collection amounting in a few weeks to no less than £600 8s. 4d. the whole of which was forwarded to England as some acknowledgement of what we owe to the Society, and some proof of the interest with which we regard its labors of love.

Your Board has thus completed its sketch of the operations of the Society during the past year. Yet what has been done by us, in any degree commensurate with the greatness of the objects on which we are engaged? We may have cheered the hearts of many by the aid we have afforded, in building up the Houses of God, in the waste places of our land; we may have helped to rear the walls of the humble Parsonage, and thus far contributed towards the permanent establishment of the ministrations of the Church in some particular locality; we may have been the honored instruments in God's hands of circulating here and there that Word of life, of which He has declared that it shall not return unto Him void; we may have put into our people's hands the Book of Common Prayer, and other works leading their thoughts from the things of time to the great concerns of eternity :- these things we may have done, and far be it from your Board to underrate the importance of efforts such as these on which we may, in full assurance of confidence, look for the Divine Blessing. But have we not left things undone? Have the fect of our Missionaries, bearing the glad tidings of the Gospel of peace, found their way in every direction to the home of the backward settler? Has the wilderness around us, (aye and close to our very doors,) a wilderness now in a double sense of the word, been yet made through our efforts, to blossom and bud as the rose? Have schools been established under the superintendence of our Clergy, wherein the young are trained in the way they should go. Nay! not one single school owns the fostering care of this Society.

To accomplish these great ends, and to feel that our Church is here putting forth the energy and vitality which (blessed be God!) she is displaying elsewhere, there is no doubt that greater efforts must be made than have yet been tried; there is no doubt that we need from each one of you, our brethern and sisters in the Lord, the aid, the strong aid of love, and faith, and prayer; then shall we be triumphant in the spiritual warfare in which we are engaged, then may we be privileged to see in our own day, and in our own land, the kingdoms of this world "becoming the kingdoms of "our Lord and of his Christ"; then at least shall we, thus laboring, attain to "that crown of glory, that fadeth not "sway, reserved in Heaven for us."
