RAILWAYS OF HAMILTON THE DUNDAS LINE IS TO BE NEWLY EQUIPPED

And Covered Into a Modern Electric Road-The T. H. & B. Directors Satisfied With Their Deal-Selecting Candidates to Contest the Seats for the Commons-General Notes.

Hamilton, April 23.—(Special)—The transformation of the Hamilton and Dundas Railway from a steam to a first-class electric line will probably be completed by July 1, the work to be commenced by July 1, the work to be completed in two months, and it is in the case, the change will popularize the road, as the traveling public are tired of riding in the old cars, and citizens are weary of the monotonous rattling of whistles and rumbling of cars, which they have heard so long.

Mr. Buckley says the cost of the work will exceed \$200,000, although the distance of only 3.4 miles. About three months will be consumed in building it, and all financial arrangements have been made. The C.P.R. will not likely take over the T. H. & B. till this spur is built.
